On the south east face is chiseled a large "X" On top of the crapping the Monument is erected of stone 4 feet high and 3 feet square at the base. A slate stone near the base bears the Legend:

From this Monument an outcropping Boulder immediately on the brow of the Agua Frio Hill $3\frac{1}{2}$ feet high and 5×3 feet at the downhill face bears N. 72° W.
