

The U. S. Mineral Monument is located upon the south eastern slope of the Agua Fria Hill - a conspicuous cone - and overlooks the entire group of claims South and East thereof. It consists of a massive rounded, ferruginous outcropping triangular on top and 4 feet high.

On the south east face is chiseled a large "X" On top of the cropping the Monument is erected of stone 4 feet high and 3 feet square at the base. A, slate stone near the base bears the legend:

U. S. M. M. I. B. B. D.

From this Monument an outcropping Boulder immediately on the brow of the Agua Fria Hill $3\frac{1}{2}$ feet high and 5×3 feet at the down hill face bears N. $72^{\circ} W.$

209 feet distant, also, outcropping $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet high bears N. $76^{\circ} 30' W.$ 317 feet distant.

This claim is situated directly on the foot of the Agua Fria Mountain. The "Black Canon" Stage Road passes the claim $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles East. The formation is granite in contact with metamorphic rocks. The lode carries silver associated with lead - principally smelting ore. Quite a number of mines in the vicinity are being profitable worked.

The "Agua Fria" Claim adjoins this location on the South.

There is no timber in the near vicinity - Water is scarce.
