In accordance with your instructions of date Jan. 15<sup>th</sup> 1881, I hereby submit the following Report. On the ~~1<sup>st</sup>~~ 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> days of February 1881 I made an official survey of Silver Glance Mine for A. H. Cuyill, situated in Silver Mining District Yuma County - A.T. -

I found the Claims, some <sup>what</sup> different from the Copy of Notice of Location, evidently caused by bad measurements and bad use of Instruments. -

I had all the Monuments identified to me, by three different parties, before making survey.

I first, in company with Mr. Milton Sauter D.S. - selected a point for a U.S. Mineral Monument. I set one at a point where all the most valuable Mines of the District can be easily connected with it. - I began survey of Mine at N end for reason, that was most easily and surely connected with U.S. M.M. Took variation of Needle, and found N. West attraction. Made survey according to the Monuments, as identified. -

Parties owning a Claim on West side of Silver Glance - claimed that their Rich Ground overlapped to within 20 feet of N end Post, thence running out 100 feet N of point of intersection with Pacific. - and asked that I place such line in my Notes and Diagram, but they failed to show or identify any Monuments to that effect, as I did not do so. -

Claimant of Pacific and Black Rock Mines - showed and identified his Boundary line and Monuments, as I placed same on Field Notes and Diagram. -

The work done on the Claim has been done by the Claimant and his Grantors and consists of one Shaft and Three open Cuts. - I made a thorough examination of the work and am satisfied that it could not be done for less than \$2000.00. - The surface of the Claim consists entirely of high rocky points and deep Gulches. The formation is Granite, the ledge clearly defined, having a dip of about 45° -

toward the East, and showing a width of from  
150 to 300 feet wide, the Hanging wall is Granite  
and the foot-wall Quartzite and Slate. -  
The specimens I send are from all parts of  
the mine. -
