Survey of Exterior Lines.

Before commencing the survey of the exterior lines of this claim I compare the meridian determined by my instrument - a Solar compass made by Young & Sons of Philadelphia - with the U.S Standard Meridian established in the District. I set my instrument over the point at the north end of said meridian marked by a brass point set in a stone block and witnessed by a post marked "U.S.S.M" etc. as per notes of the establishment of said meridian. I took an observation for latitude and at a proper time set off the declination and found the meridian described by my instrument to coincide exactly with the U.S. Standard Meridian. The variation of the needle of my instrument as it stood was $12^{\circ}15'$ East. The variation of the needle of the instrument used in establishing the meridian was $11^{\circ}53'$ East a difference of $22'$ which adopting $11^{\circ}53'$ East as the Standard variation must in my instrument be called "instrumental-error" and allowance made for it in the following survey.

I examine the corners of the claim, referring to a copy of the location notice for guidance. I find the corners well marked by monuments, the ground located essentially as indicated in said location no-

At a point on the E. line of claim S. $5^{\circ} 59' W.$ 6.73 chs. from cor. No. 6, a shaft on claim bears S. $54^{\circ} 45' W.$ 2.75 chs. distant. This shaft is a double compartment 4×4 ft and 300 ft deep. It is timbered and from it at different levels run levels, aggregating over 400 ft in length.

Comparison of bearings of adjoining lines

From cor. No. 7 to No. 2 the line coincides with line of Contention Claim. I make the bearing

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of this line to be N. $65^{\circ}40'W.$ In the field notes of the Constitution Claim, it is given as N. $65^{\circ}42'W.$ ^{Loc no. 37} a difference of 2'. This is the corresponding difference I found in the survey of the "Flora Morrison" and in the survey of the "Cincinnati"

From Secs. No. 2 to No. 3 the line coincides with a line of the Yellow Jacket Claim, which is the prolongation of the Constitution side line. I make the bearing of this line to be N. $24^{\circ}20'E.$ In the field notes of the Yellow Jacket, ^{Loc no. 39} it is given as N. $24^{\circ}18'E.$ a difference of 2'. This same difference I found in the survey of the "Flora Morrison" and Cincinnati Claims.

From Secs. No. 3 to No. 4 the line coincides with a line of the Tranquillity Claim, ^{Loc no. 49} I make the bearing of this line to be N. $53^{\circ}33'E.$ In the field notes of the Tranquillity, ^{Loc no. 49} it is given as N. $53^{\circ}34'E.$ a difference of 1'. All these differences are slight.

General Description etc.

The Continental Mining Claim is situated in the Leadstone Mining District, Gila County, Arizona Territory. It adjoins the Constitution and other prominent claims of the District. Its surface is uneven and rocky. There is very little vegetation on it, a little brush, - no timber. The work done on it, as described in the foregoing notes amounts to many times five hundred dollars in value.
