The North east corner was marked by two monuments, and it has been agreed upon by the claimants of the Extacy mine and the claimants of the adjoining mines, that the monument shown on plat is the true and original north east corner and that the one marked on Plat as C. is an error, but it was the one by which the claim was connected with the U. S. M. M. No 2, in the location notice, and would have made an excess in length of claim.

The South end center was in excess of 750 feet from Initial Monument and has been moved to proper distance

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
