By comparison with the U. S Standard Meridian established for Tombstone District I find the variation of the needle to be  $11^{\circ}30'$  East.

In the Field Notes of establishment of a true Meridian for Tombstone Mining District the variation is given  $11^{\circ}53'$  East giving a difference in the instrument readings of  $23''$  minutes.

I commence at the initial monument as described in the location notice, where I set post 4x4 ins sq 5 ft long, 1 ft in ground and build around it a mound of stone, marked "H. M. C. No. 1." from which,


