The U. S. Mineral Monument No. 1 - Rock District is situated on the high divide between Warrior Gulch and Crazy Basin Creek. It consists of a heavy iron dyke  $45' \times 17'$  at the base 26 feet high above ground and but slightly broken. On the highest point of this dyke the Monument is erected of stones - it is 4 feet sq. at base  $6\frac{1}{2}$  feet high and bears the legend "U. S. M. M. N° I P. D."

It is visible from any point of the so called "Prince Group" of Mines which occupy nearly the whole of Crazy Basin from this Monument a Gneiss boulder  $7' \times 4' \times 4'$  marked "X" bears S.  $25^{\circ} 30' W.$  262 feet distant - also:

a Gneiss boulder  $4' \times 3' \times 4'$  distinguished by a long and slender point in which it terminates marked X bears S.  $21^{\circ} 5' E.$

The formation is granite and phosphoritic slate - No timber or surface water in immediate neighborhood.

The claim is bounded on the North by the "Wild Pigeon" - south by the "Evening Star" and East by the "Second south extension of the Silver Prince" and "Black Warrior" claims, unsurveyed.




