The posts, and find the bearing of my instrument to be $S. 48^{\circ} 22' E.$ and the official Notes of the Toughnut furnished me give the bearing $S 48^{\circ} 08' E.$ with a variation of $11^{\circ} 03'$

A portion of the same line being the N. E. line of 1st South Extension of Toughnut. Being the same line the official notes furnished me give the course at $S 48^{\circ} 30' E.$ with a variation of $11^{\circ} 53'$

A part of this difference is caused by the N. W. corner stake of 1st South Extension of the Toughnut being set $\frac{3}{10}$ of a foot south of the line.

The N. E. line of the Goodenough Mining Claim is bounded by the N. W. end of the Way Up and Gilded Age Mining Claims. Both having been officially surveyed and being furnished with a copy of the Field Notes I select a point from which I can see the entire length of line and find the course by my instrument to be $N. 48^{\circ} 22' W.$ while the notes furnished me give this line at $N. 48^{\circ} 15' W.$ The Way Up Mining Claim having been run with a variation of $11^{\circ} 15' E.$

The East end line of the Virginia Mining Claim being the West end line of the Goodenough. I find the bearing to be $S 41^{\circ} 10' W.$

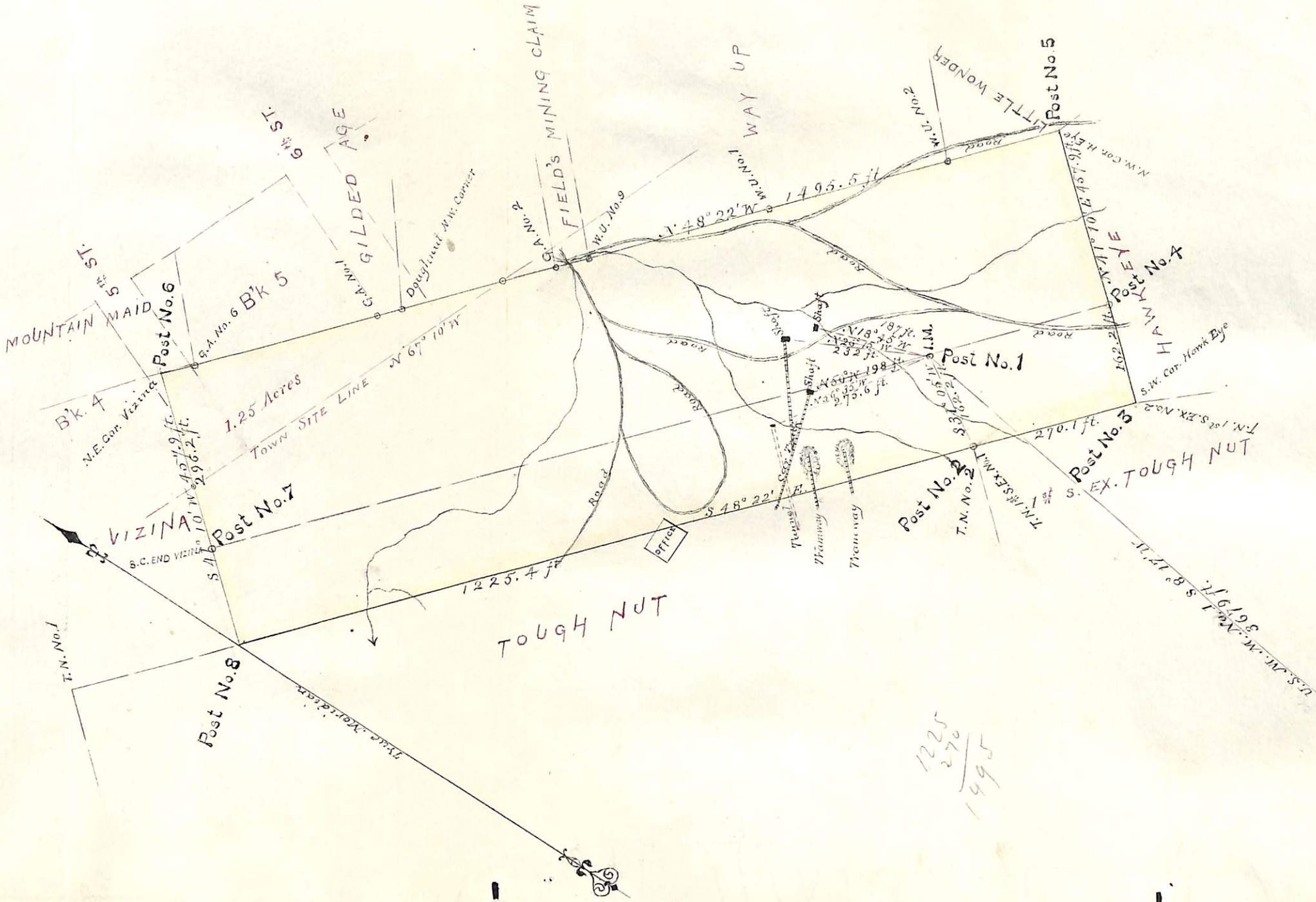
