1877. "Mining Notice." The undersigned  
hereby claim for mining purposes  
Fifteen hundred (1500 ft) linear feet along  
this Mineral Ledge Lode or Deposit,  
commencing at this Monument of  
stones and running in a South-Eastly  
direction to a stone monument, with  
a uniform width of six hundred feet  
(600 ft) to gather with all the dips  
angles and spurs appertaining or be-  
longing to the same, and all the  
ores or metals therein contained, claiming  
all the right and privileges conferred  
by the Mining laws of the United  
States. This location or claim shall






