General Description

The "Buena Vista Mining Claim" is situated on the rolling hills, about one mile easterly from the village of Charleston; about eight miles southwesterly, from the City of Tombstone; and is about midway between the Bradshaw Mine, and the old Bronkow House, all in Tombstone District, Cochise County, Arizona.

The Improvements, made by the claimants, consist of two shafts.

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Shaft No 1 - is 5x7 feet on the surface, and has been sunk on an incline with a slight dip, toward the south east, to a depth of 33 feet.

Shaft No 2 - is 4x6 feet on the surface, and has been sunk on a perpendicular to a depth of 25 feet.

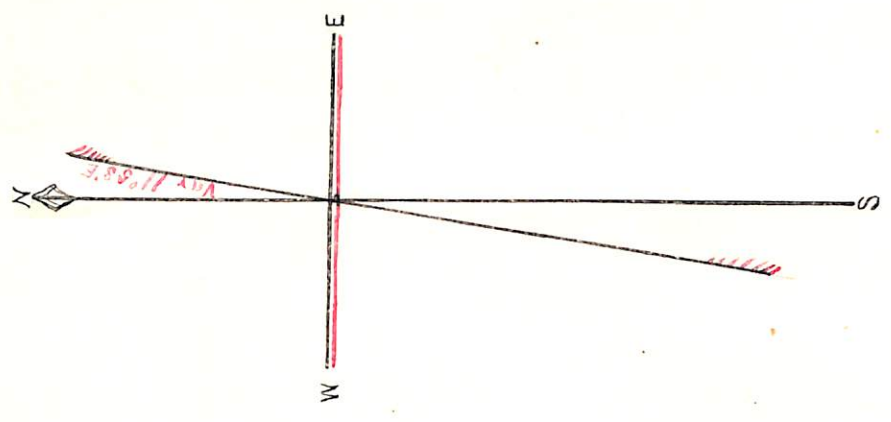
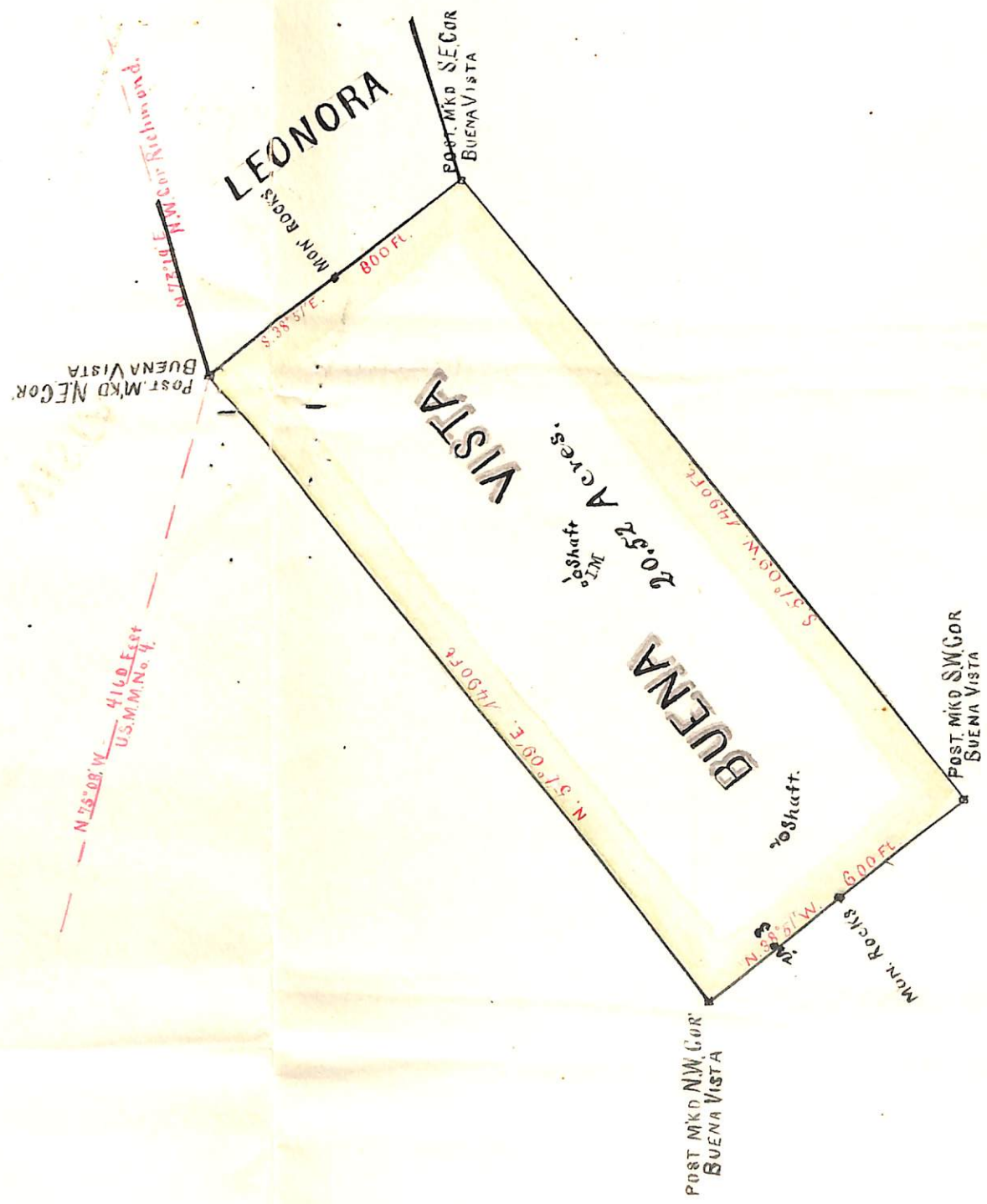
