I commenced the survey at the

Here I set a post 4 inches square,




Diagram of the Lucky Sure Mining Claim

## General Description.

The Luck Sure Mining Claim is situated in Tombstone Mining District, Cochise County, Arizona, and was located as the first southerly extension of the Lucky Cuss. But the Lucky Cuss, when first located, was too long, and when surveyed for a patent, 160 feet were left between the south end centre of the Lucky Cuss and the initial Monument of the Luck Sure. This fraction was located by Richard Bird E. L. & A. E. Schieffelin, W. S. Edwards, and others, some of whom were creators of the Lucky Cuss, and was named the "Hic Carrus." The original stakes of the Luck Sure mining claim were shown me by E. L. Schieffelin in the Spring of 1880, at the time the Luck Sure was sold by Mr. Crook to W. P. Bork, and by these stakes I made the survey.

This claim lies along the southwest slope of Lucky Cuss hill, and takes in U. S. M. M. No. 2, and is cut by the N. E. corner of the Sunbeam Mining Claim, Lot No. 50. Surface abrupt and rocky.

The work and improvements upon this claim <sup>made by claimant and his partners</sup>, consist of two shafts and a drift, the value of which, I hereby certify, exceeds the sum of Five Hundred dollars.






