sonally interested in said mine.

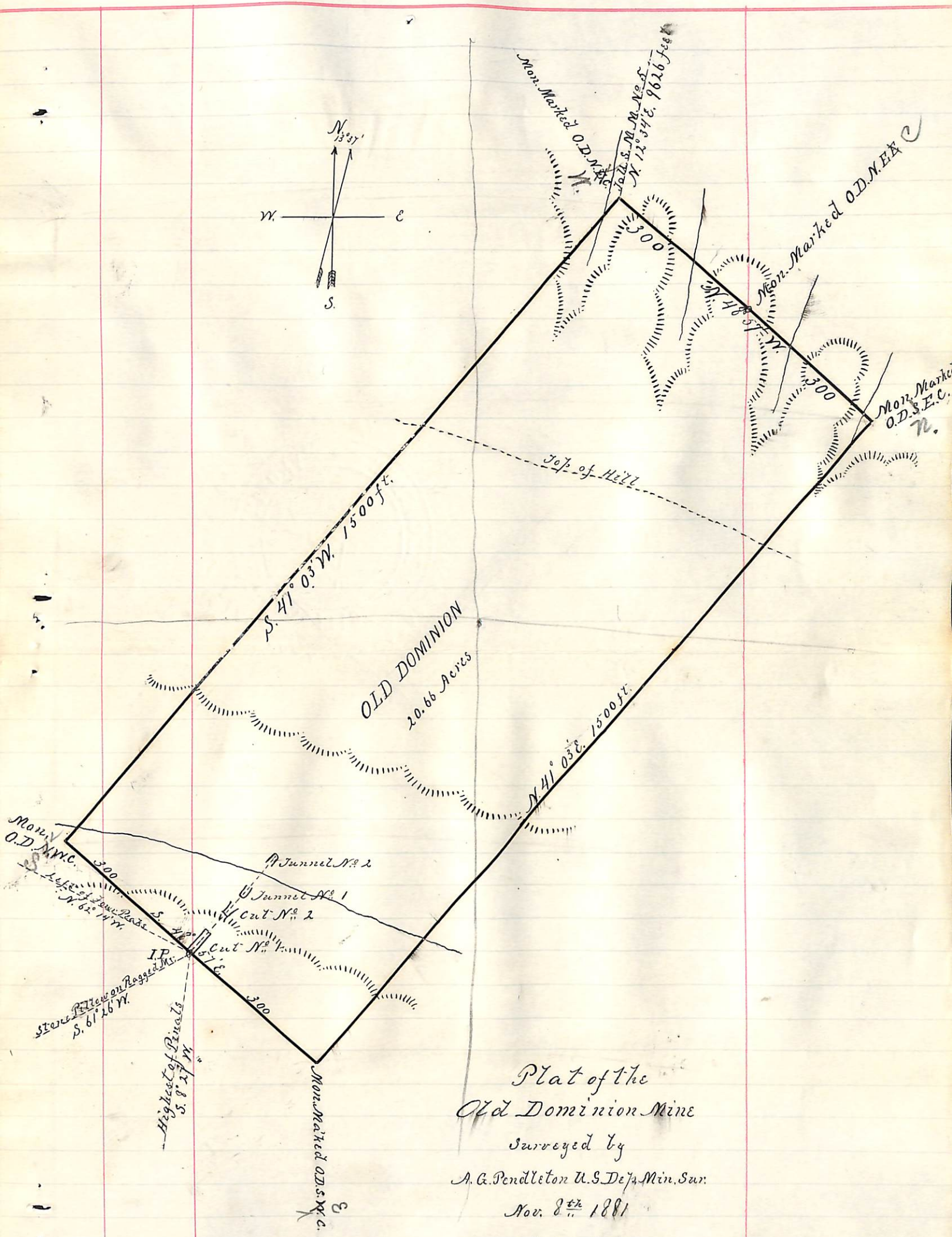
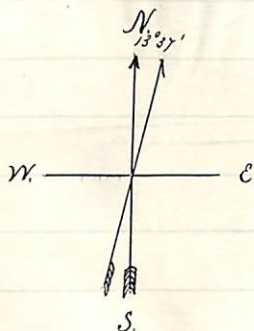
