In order to prove conclusively that the center of the North East end of the May Mining Claim is located upon the ledge. I have caused a shaft 4x5 ft. and 5 feet deep to be sunk 340 ft. and 5 ft distant from Post No 5. and as indicated upon the diagram accompanying Survey sheet from this shaft I have taken the sample of ore occurring in this shaft.

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
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
