In compliance with instructions from the Surveyor G. for Arizona, bearing date Jan 21st 1882 - to survey the "Goshen" Mining claim, claimed by Hugh White, which claim is situated in the Patagonia Mounts, no district, Pima Co., and finding no monument of any U. S. survey within legal distance from said claim, I herewith, Jan. 23, proceed to erect such ^{U. S. mineral} monument as follows:

This mine has been worked by Mexicans before it passed to grantors of present owners, the Mexicans made a big open cut - near to the G.I.M., 14 feet wide 20 feet deep and 30 feet long - also a small shaft at bottom and Northend of cut, 20 feet deep 4' x 6'.

The present owners and their grantors have run:

Upper tunnel 56 feet long x 6' x 4 1/2'
A drift 18 feet x 6' x 4 1/2'
Lower tunnel 15 feet x 6' x 4 1/2'
A shaft at Southend of big cut, 10' x 10' x 10'.

I hereby certify that this work, excluding the above mentioned Mexican work, does amount to more than five hundred dollars U. S. C.

General Description.

The "Goshen" is located about 4 miles North^(west) of the town of Harshaw, on a prominent hill of quartzite and some limestone. The vein seems to lay flat - its strike is North and South and its dip about 45° West as far as present developments indicate.

Its ores are a ponderous body of more than 10 feet of carbonates and oxides of lead, covered by limonite. Its ores contain little silver. Hundreds of tons of ore are on the dump.

This mine was formerly known as the "Flux"
