By virtue of an Act of Congress of May 10<sup>th</sup> 1872, and all such other mining laws of the U.S. and Territories, we the undersigned claim 1500 feet on this lode of Gold and Silver Minerals, and 300 feet on each side, more fully described as follows: 750 ft North East and 750 ft South West from center Monument of stones and 300 feet crossing said ends to other stone monuments of stone. 
