By comparison with the U.S. Standard Meridian established for Tombstone Mining District, I find the variation of my instrument to be $11^{\circ}25' \text{ East}$.

I commence at the initial monument of the claim where I find a 1 inch round iron. 8" inches long sunk in the ledge on the south side of a cut leading to a tunnel. This iron pin has been placed in center of original Initial monument and directly beneath where it originally stood.

I run a preliminary line through the center of claim and find the bearing to be $573^{\circ}54'E$ and $273^{\circ}54'W$

I measure along the center line of claim. $273^{\circ}54'W$

And find the west center end monument to be

General Description.

Sir:

Enclosed with this letter please find Plot of Survey of Merry Christmas Mining Claims as I find the stakes and monuments. The side lines, 1st from post No 111 to No 11 the distance given me on plot is 470. ft while the actual distance carefully measured gives the distance at 449.7 ft.

The line from Post No 11 to Post No 1. - Distance given to me is 470. ft. while the measured distance gives the line at 453.9 ft in length.

The red lines show the position of the original corners of the Merry Christmas mining claims.

By reference to surveys made July 10th. 1880. I find two of the monuments with the stakes fully described, and the same stakes were standing on the old line (Red line) the 1st of last November, and one of the stakes is now standing; I have been instructed in all Official Surveys to be very careful not to go outside of the original

- stakes and monuments ^{1st} placed or put up by the original locator, and if there is any doubt or question to take testimony, and from this evidence determine where the corners were ^{1st} placed.

I was very much surprised when I went upon the ground to Survey the Knoxville to see the new stakes marked M.X. as; and I took no notice of them in a preliminary Survey of last November. And in the official Survey I did not think that the Merry Christmas had been officially surveyed, for the monuments are very small and posts can be easily removed the monuments cannot stand for all time, nor for any length of time. I am sorry to state this but they are the facts. In this Survey I had for Chainmen Geo S. Rice, a Civil Engineer for six years in charge of the Water works at Boston and Mr Trull, who was his assistant there, was also his assistant in the measurement of the Lines of the Knoxville and Merry Christmas. In the Field Notes of the Knoxville I do not mention or show the original lines of location of the Merry Christmas, but show the position of the stakes as they are placed now upon the ground.
