Field Notes of the official Survey of the Holbrook Mfg. claim

Being under instructions from the Surveyor General of Arizona, bearing date April 1st 1882, to survey the "Holbrook" Mining claim, Warren dist., Lachise Co. A. T. and claimed by Charles Vincent, John W. Blair and Joseph Russell, I the undersigned dep't. M. Surv^r proceed to the ground April 20 1882.

I find Varⁿ by Polaris N 12° 35' E.

I start my survey on the center mout. of the Western End of the claim where I plant a pine post 4"x4"x4' painted white and marked:

H.W.C. U.S.S. and surround it with a mout. of rocks 2 feet high.

From here I take 2 bearings

General Remarks.

The Holbrook is situated about 2 miles East of the Bisbee Smelting Works, and South of the ^{the Cave claims} Payment and East of ^{the} ~~the~~.
 The ores contained in its shafts are ^{varied} oxidized copper ores - the country rock is limestone containing big bodies of limonite & oxidized copper ores.

The location on the ground agrees fairly with the location notice except that the width is only about 500 feet, ~~there too~~ ^{and} claimed.

The Area as contained within monuments is ~~of~~ $1 \frac{8}{100}$ Acres.
 The triangle cut off by the "Baster" is ~~of~~ .100 acres but the Holbrook parties do not intend to relinquish it, but claim it as their own, and it is included in the Area of $1 \frac{8}{100}$ acres.


