Being under instructions from the Surveyor Genl. of Arizona, bearing date March 13<sup>th</sup> 1882, to execute the survey of the "Copper King" Mining claim, claimed by John Ballard and Edward Reiley, which claim is situated in Warren Mining dist., Cochise County, I, the undersigned U. S. Dep't. Min. Surv., March 16<sup>th</sup> proceed to the Southeast corner of said claim.

### General description.

The "Copper King" Mine is located to-  
wards the West of the Copper Queen  
claim, on a very rough limestone  
hill covered with dense brush and  
some black and white oak and a few  
pine. Water is scarce. The ore depo-  
sits so far as discovered are rather ir-  
regular, and seem to lay between the  
limestone strata and dip about  $60^{\circ}$   
North and with a strike of E and W.

The ores are very rich carbonates and  
oxides of copper in a quartzose limestone  
gangue.

Survey of the 'Copper King' claim, Warren Dist.

The survey as executed by me gives much less ground than the location notice calls for - but I followed the monuments which were put up and accepted by former owners and adjoining claimants who are responsible for any defect.

I find that the 'Atlanta' patent survey cuts off a small triangle containing  $\frac{4}{100}$  of an acre of the 'Copper King', to which the claimants of the 'Copper King' do not submit, but intend to put in an adverse claim against the 'Atlanta', on the ground that the location of the 'Copper King' is anterior to the location of the 'Atlanta'.
