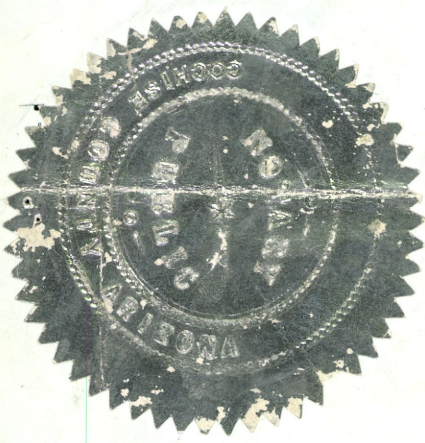

Having adjusted Transit to agree with True Meridian laid down by Raskridge and Kelleher, with variation $11^{\circ}53' E$ by Obs to Polaris.

I start at initial monument marked A on plat where I plant post 4×6 5 feet long with stone monument and mark thereon No I B. T. M. C. from this cut 2 feet deep 4×6 bears $S 18^{\circ}45' W$ dist 6 feet and U. S. M. M. 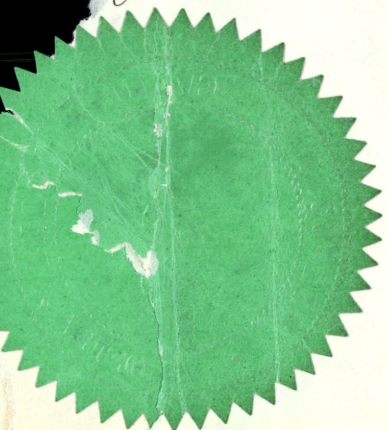
