By comparison with the U. S. Standard Meridian established for Tombstone Mining District, I find the variation of my instrument to be  $11^{\circ} 25' \text{ East}$ .

Beginning at the Initial Monument I find in a monument of stones a 2x4 inch pine stake, marked with lead pencil, "N. Cent. Franklin"; and beneath the post, in a tin box, a copy of the original and supplemental Location Notices. At this point I set into the ground 1 ft. a post 4 ins. square, 5 ft. long, marked "I. M. 
