11° 25' East

Beginning at the Initial Monument as described in the notice of location: a stake, or post, marked "Initial Center Randolph Mine", set in a monument of stones, I find a copy of the original and supplemental Location Notices, in a tin can placed in monument at foot of post.

Randolph No 2 M.C.



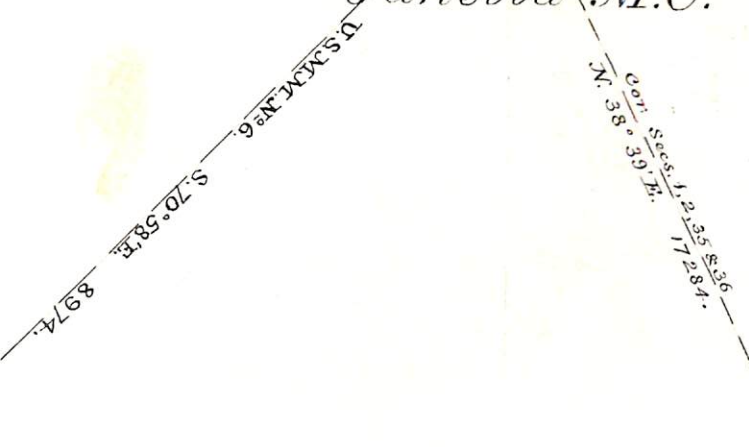
