By comparison with the U.S. Standard Meridian established for Tombstone Mining District, I find the variation of my transit to be  $11^{\circ} 25'$  East

Beginning at the Initial Monument as described in the notice of location: a stake, or post, marked "Initial Center Randolph Mine"; set in a monument of stones, I find a copy of the original and supplemental Location Notices, in a tin can placed in monument at foot of post.

At this point I set into the ground 1 ft. a post 4 ins. square, 5 ft. long, marked "I.M. Randolph M.C. No 1.", replacing the old post alongside, and rebuild around them both a monument of stones and earth, 4 ft. diameter at base and 3 ft. high.




