"Shaft No 2" is sunk upon an incline to a depth of 37 feet. and is 4x6. feet on the surface.

The "Cut" is 4. feet wide, and has been run upon the ledge twelve feet, having a face of 3. feet. in height.

The croppings are prominent in many places through the center of the mine, appearing within a few feet of the center of south end, while the north end center <sup>mount</sup> is built directly upon the croppings of the ledge.






