Notice of Location. - Notice is hereby given, that the undersigned, in compliance with the requirements of the Mining Act of Congress, approved May 10<sup>th</sup>, 1872, has this day located and claim Fifteen hundred linear feet along the course of this lead, lode or vein of mineral bearing quartz. 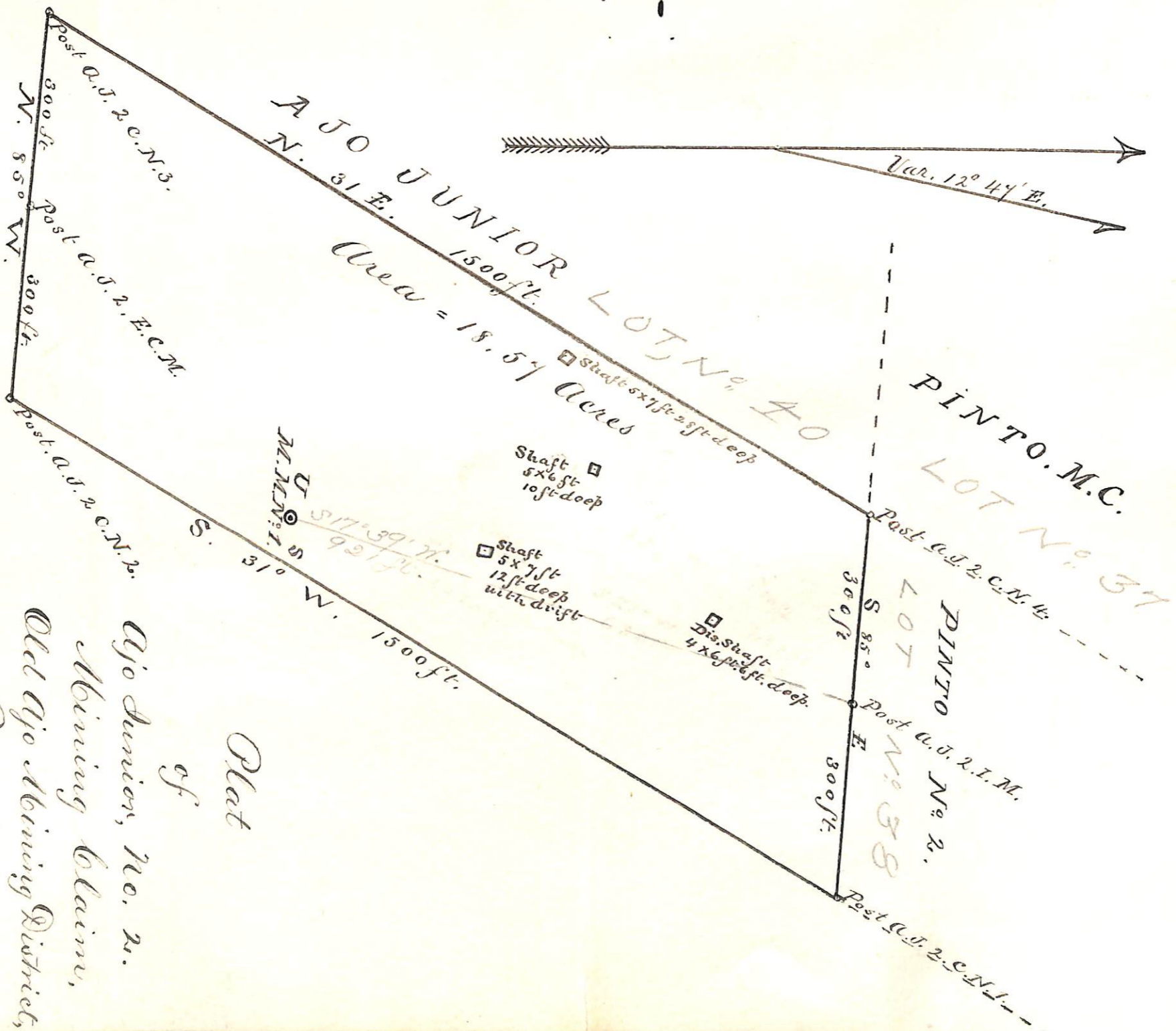
