By comparing the bearing of my Instrument (an Engineers Transit) with the Standard Meridian established in Tombstone District: Jan 19<sup>th</sup> 1881, under instructions from U. S. Surveyor General, I find the variation of the needle to be 11° 53' East.

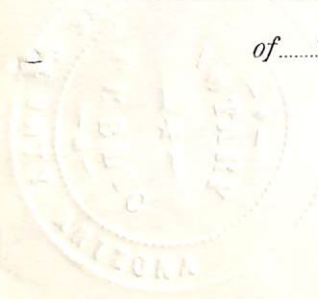

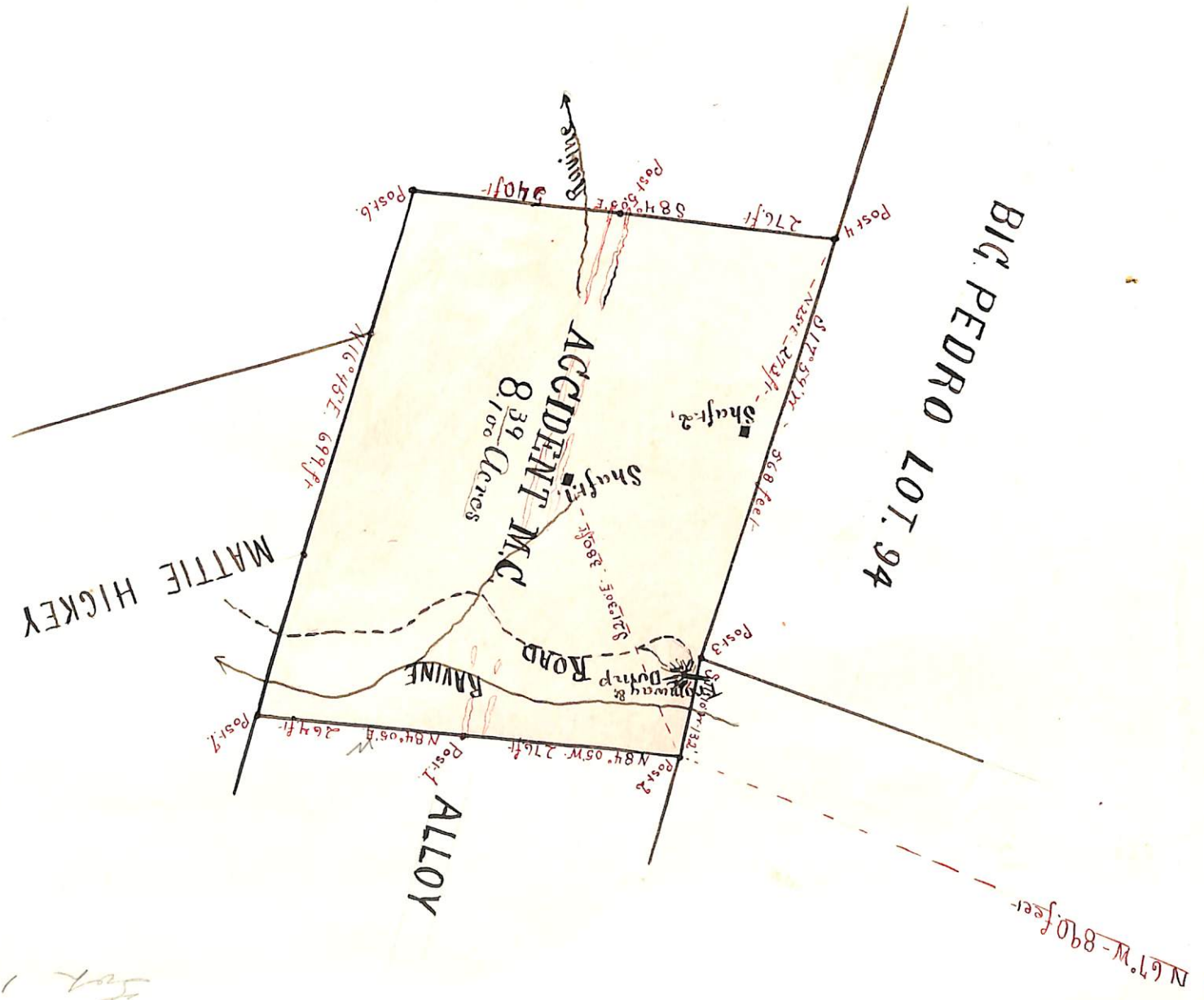


