In accordance with the provisions of "an act of Congress" of the United States of America, approved May 10th 1872, and amendments thereto, the undersigned claim for Mining purposes the vein or lode called the Aztec, situated in Copper Basin Mining District, Yavapai County, Arizona Territory. Said claim is bounded and described as follows to wit:

Commencing at a monument of stone on the vein, running thence in a southerly direction at right angles with the vein 300⁰ three hundred feet to a monument, thence easterly parallel with the vein 1500⁰ fifteen hundred feet to a monument, thence northerly at right angles with the vein 1600⁰ feet to a monument, thence westerly parallel with the vein 1500⁰ fifteen hundred feet to a monument, thence southerly at right angles with the vein 300⁰ three hundred feet to the place of beginning.
