Of the Official Survey of the
Dreadnought Mining Claim,
situated in Cochise Mining

In accordance with instruc-
-tions dated March 12th 1883,
from the U. S. Surveyor General
of Arizona,

I commenced the survey
March 30th 1883, after adjust-
-ing instrument, an engineers
transit, manufactured by John
Roach of San Francisco, Cal.
and establishing the true Mer-
-idian by observation of Polaris
March 29th 1883, and found the
Magnetic Variation to be
12° 20' East, and carried the
courses in this survey, by in-
-strumental measurement
of horizontal angles.

Have compared the Certified
location notice, with the
notice found in the initial
monument, and with the
monuments as they exist upon
the ground, and find it cor-
-rect, except in some parts
an excess in distances

Commencing at the Initial



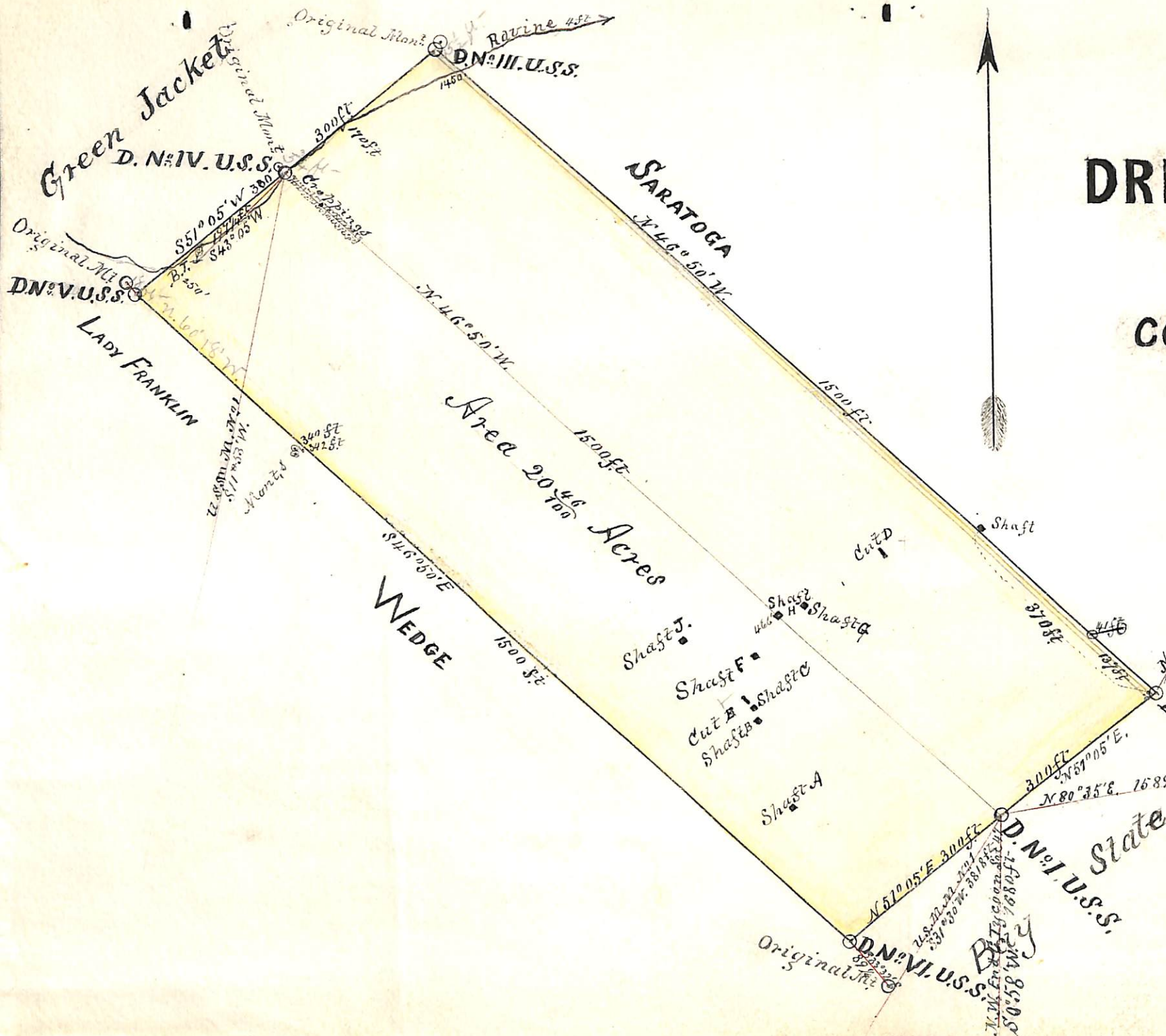
