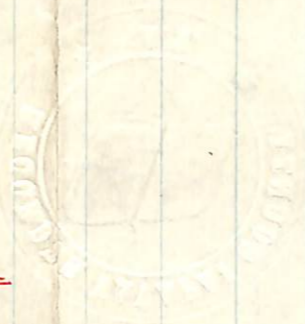

## Bronze Statue Notice of Location

The undersigned claim for mining purposes Fifteen Hundred (1500) feet of this Quartz Ledge, in length along the ledge or vein, and Three Hundred (300) feet on each side of the middle of the vein at the surface, together with all the dips, spurs, and angles, and all valuable mineral deposits contained therein, and all timber growing within the limits of said claim, and all water and water privileges thereon or appurtenant thereto, under and according to the provisions of an Act of Congress, approved May 10<sup>th</sup> 1872, entitled "An Act to promote the development of the mining Resources of the United States."

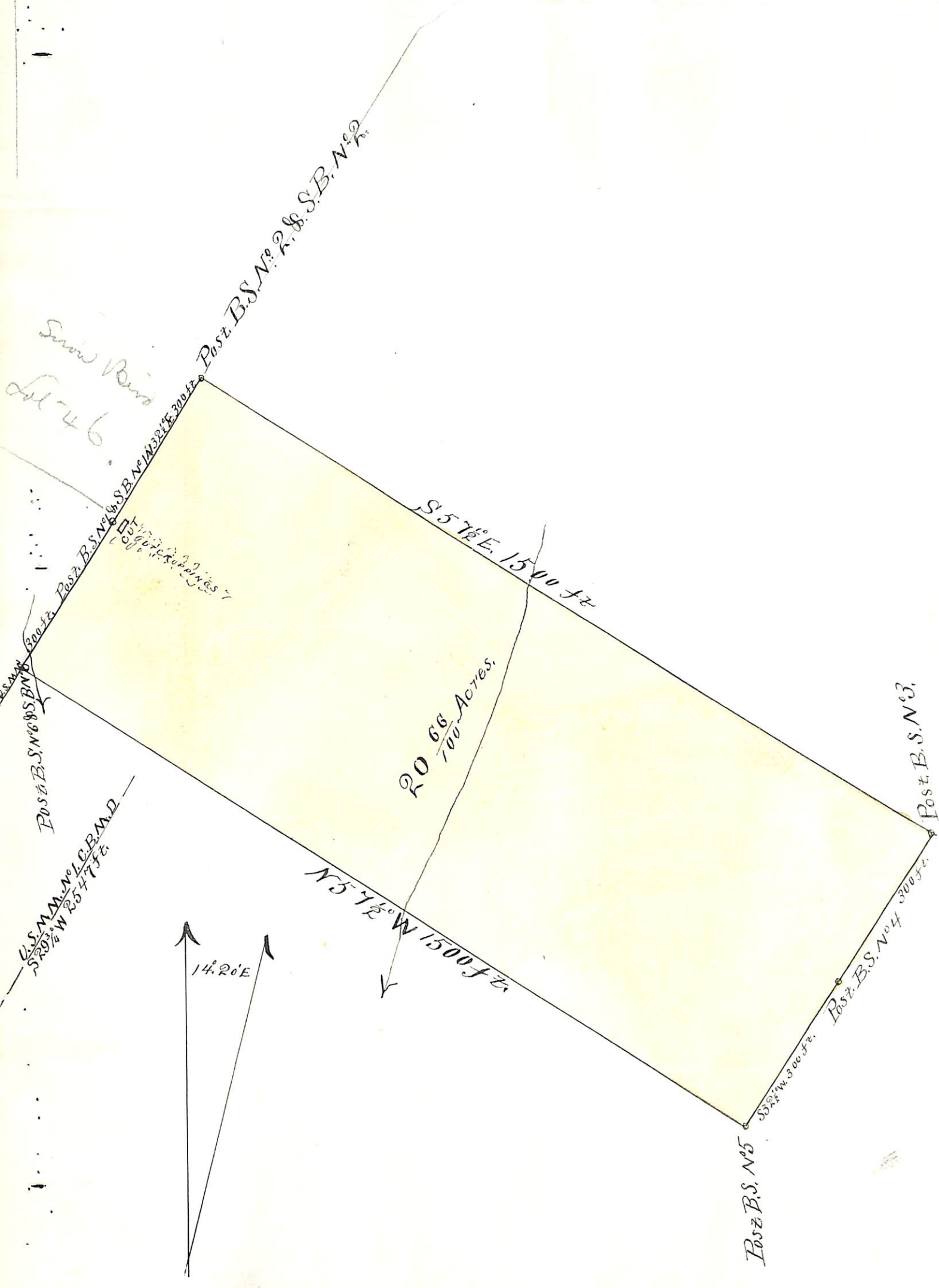
