Know all men by these Presents: That we the undersigned have this day located Fifteen Hundred (1500) Lines or feet of this vein or ledge, bearing precious metals, with all dips, spurs, angles and variations, with surface ground Three Hundred (300) feet on each side of the center of vein, with all mineral deposits contained thereto, and all timber growing within the limits of said claim, and all water and water privileges thereon or appertaining thereto, under and according to the provisions of the United States Mining Laws, under which it is located.

This claim commences at this Monument and Notice placed upon the ledge, beside an old shaft about fifteen feet deep, and runs Five Hundred feet in a North-Westerly direction, and one thousand feet in a South easterly direction along the ledge.

The exterior boundaries are as follows, viz: commencing at a monument of stone on West boundary line distant Three Hundred (300) feet in a westerly direction

from Discovery monument; thence in a Northwesterly direction parallel with the ledge Five Hundred feet to monument of stone at N.W. corner; thence in an easterly direction at right angles across the ledge Six Hundred (600) feet to monument of stone at N.E. corner of claim; thence in a Southerly direction parallel with the ledge Fifteen Hundred (1500) feet to monument of stone at S.E. corner of claim; thence at right angles across the ledge in a Westerly direction Six Hundred (600) feet to monument of stone at S.W. corner of claim; thence in a Northwesterly direction parallel with the ledge One thousand feet to monument on west boundary and place of beginning.


