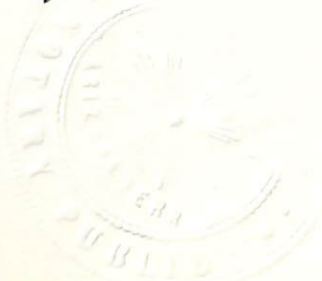

Amended Location Notice of the Petanke Mine.

Petanke. - Location Notice. Notice is hereby given, That the undersigned, in compliance with the requirements of the Mining Act of Congress, approved May 10, 1872, has this day relocated and claimed 1500 hundred linear feet along the course of this lead, lode or vein of mineral bearing quartz, and 300 feet in width on each side of the middle of said lead, lode or vein, situate in the Cababi Mining District, County of Pima, Arizona, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit: Commencing at this monument of stones, being the center of the Easterly End of claim and upon which this notice is posted; thence Northerly (300) three hundred feet to a monument of stones; thence Westerly (1500) fifteen hundred feet to a monument of stones; thence Southerly (300) three hundred feet to a monument of stones, being the center of Westerly end of claim; thence Southerly (50) fifty feet to a monument of stones; thence Easterly (1500) fifteen hundred feet to a monument of stones; thence Northerly (50) fifty feet to place of beginning.

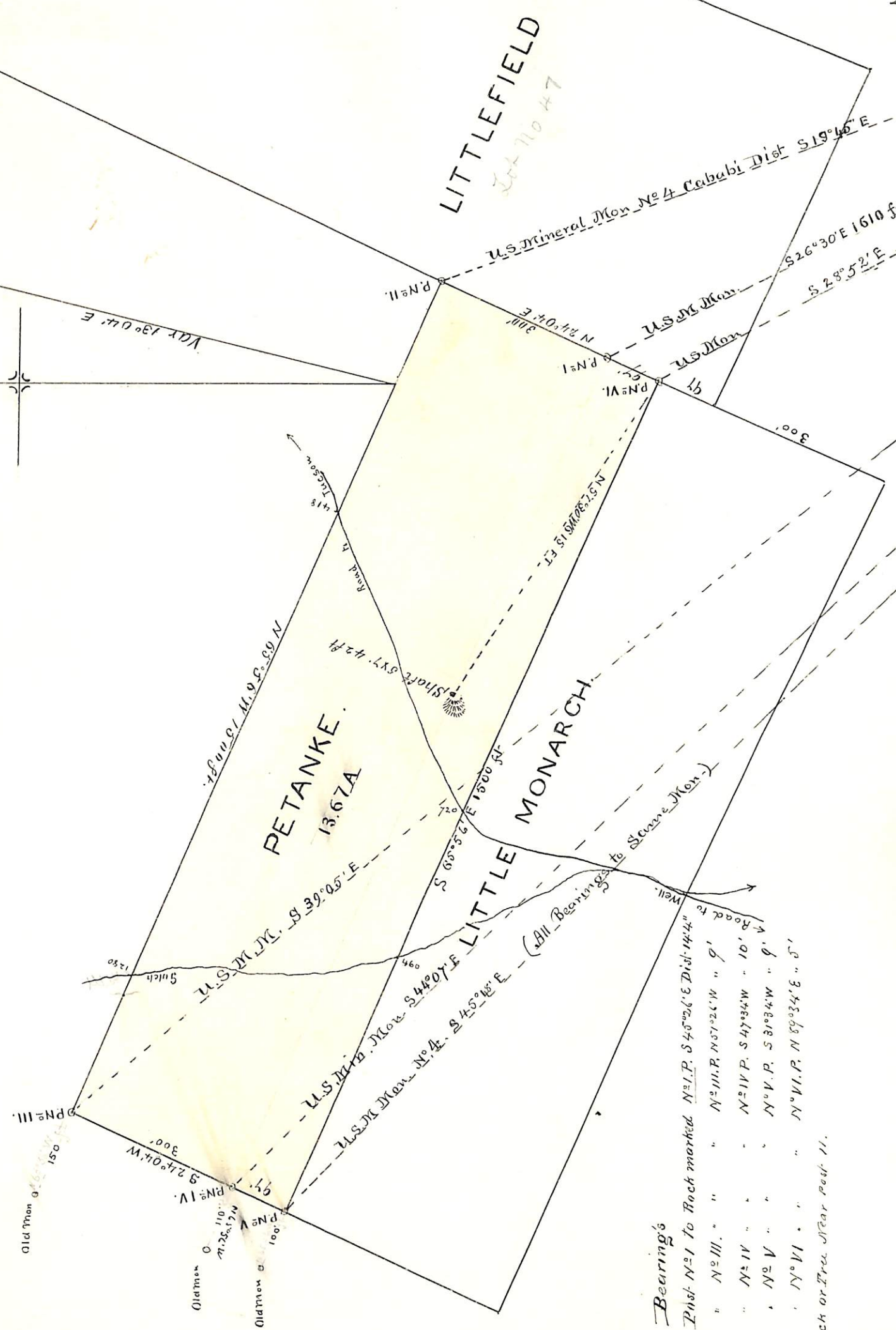
