The S.E. cor. is established N 56° 52' W 3 ft. distant from the N.E. cor. of lot No 41 making a difference of 3 ft in the chaining on this boundary line, probably arising from the fact that said N.E. cor. of lot No 41 is marked by a monument of loose stones.

The N.E. cor. of Mark Twain mining claim is identical with original N.E. cor. as marked on ground. The central monument of the N.E. end of the Mark Twain claim is not identical with the original neither is the S.W. cor. monument of said mining claim identical with the corresponding cor. monument on the ground and described in certified copy of location notice. 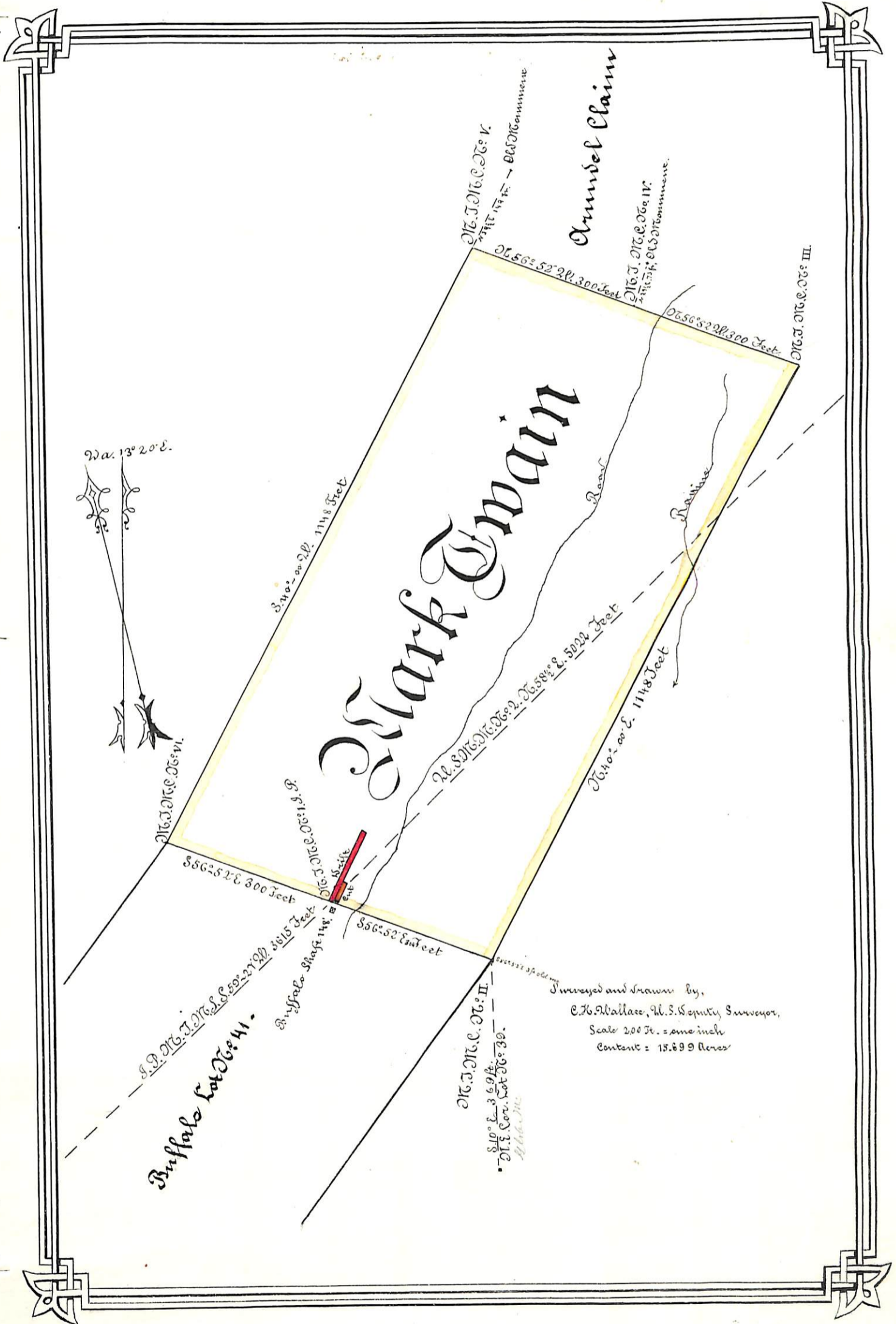

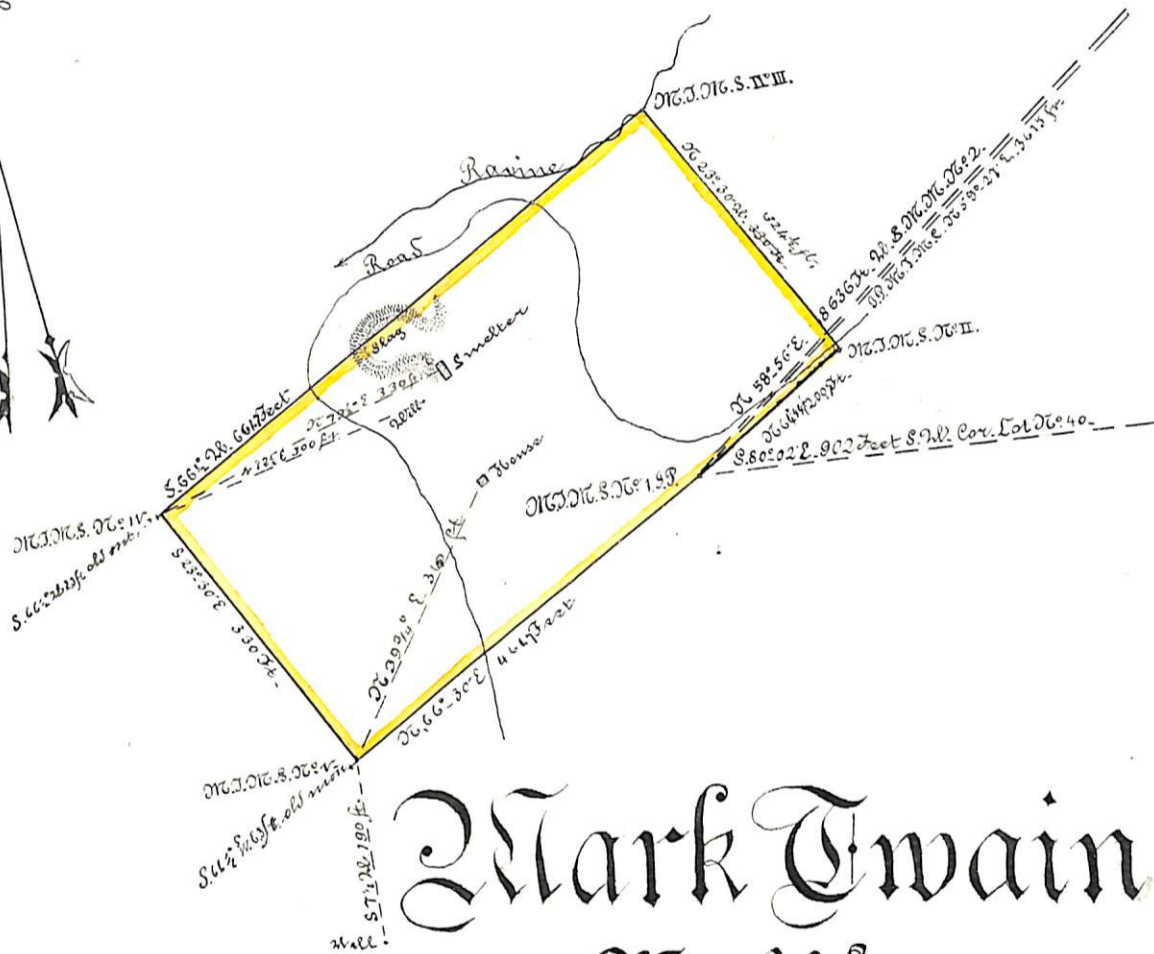
