The Survey has been executed
with a Keller and Brightley Transit
(Philadelphia make)

I determined the true meridian
by equal shadows of the sun, making
my observations at the time of the
Summer Solstice, June 21st 1883 and
obtained fourteen (14) degrees and thirty five
(25) minutes east as the variation.

The survey and the location de-
scribed in the certified copy of record
of location are identical.

The improvements made by appli-
cants for survey and by their grantors
consist of a shallow shaft on main lode
known as the discovery shaft, also
one shaft on Spur sixty five (65) feet deep.

The vein on said spur has been stopeled
on both sides, from the bottom to
near surface, for a distance of
50 feet more or less on either side.

From the foot of the hill, a tun-
nel two hundred and fourteen (214)
feet long, connects with the main
lode, on which a cross tunnel
ten (10) feet long, shows same char-
acter as one, as discovery shaft.

The value of the labor and improve-
ments upon the Metallic Accident Mine


