The survey has been executed with a Nelle and Brightley Transit (Philadelphia make).

I determined the true meridian by equal shadows of the sun making my observations at the time of the summer solstice, June 21st 1883, and obtained fourteen (14) degrees and twenty-five (25) minutes east as the variation.

The survey and the location described in the certified copy of record of location are identical.

Improvements put upon claim by claimants and their grantors, consist of one shaft forty (40) feet deep, one shaft thirty (30) feet deep, and one cross cut on the vein ten (10) feet long.

The value of labor and improvements placed upon the Juno Mine by the applicants and their grantors is not less than five hundred (\$500) dollars.

The stake and monument which showed mark the corner common to Sections 33, 34, 3 and 4 Townships 23 and 24 N. of R 18 W. with which this survey has been connected must have been destroyed, as the spot where it should be only shows remnants of the monument originally built there, this said spot is situated at the N.W. corner of an old adobe house, near the town of

Chloride, and which wall I have marked with the letter S, for future identification.


