The notice of location describes the claim as running East and West, when in reality the ledge is a North and South one - The locator was apparently unacquainted with the points of the compass. It is a well known claim and several thousands of dollars have been expended on it in developments. The ledge on which the claim is located can be traced for the distance of at least  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles. It is the first north extension of the Lone Valley mining claim. That the ground surveyed is the same as intended to be described in notice of location is beyond any doubt.

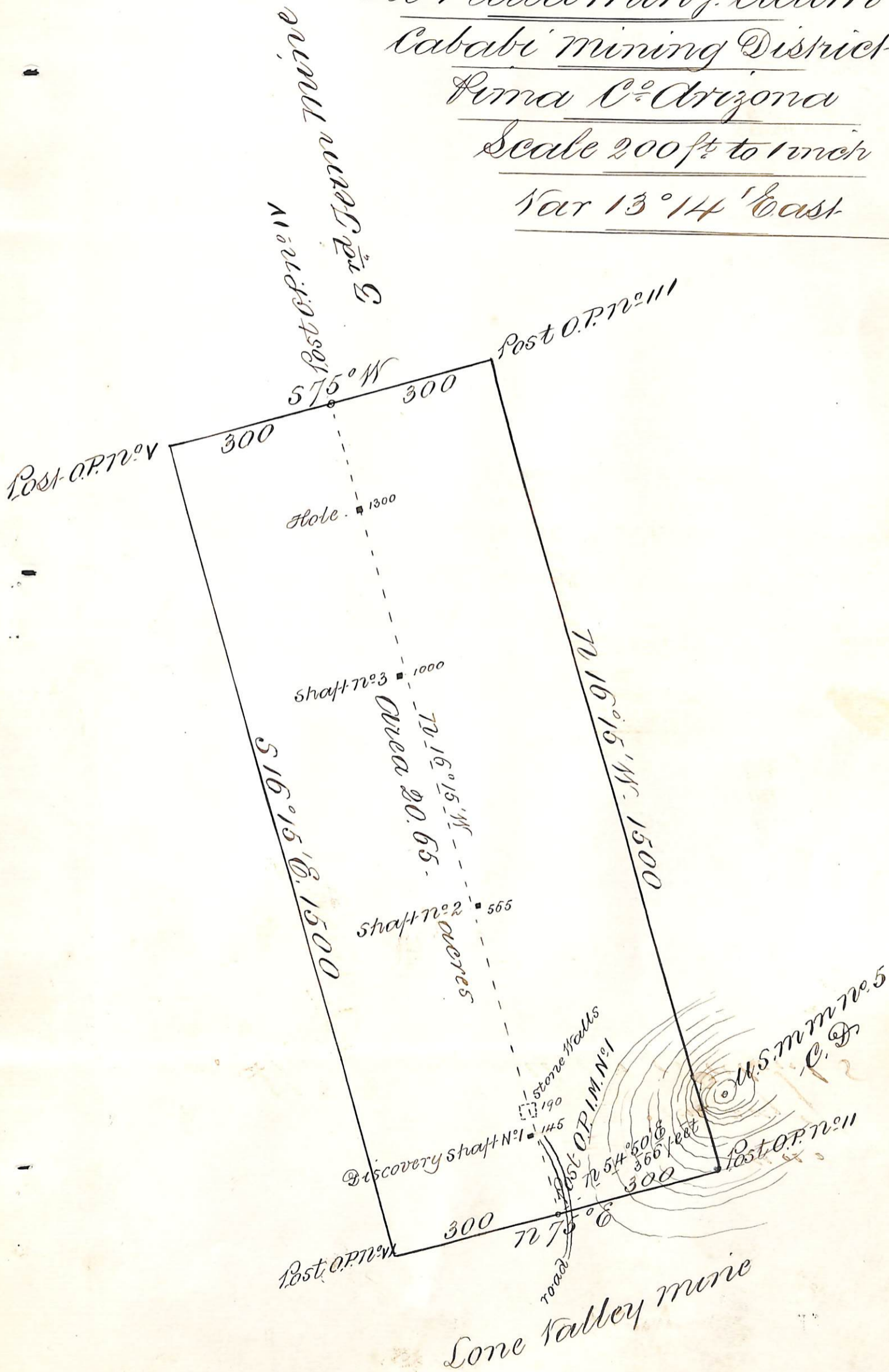
