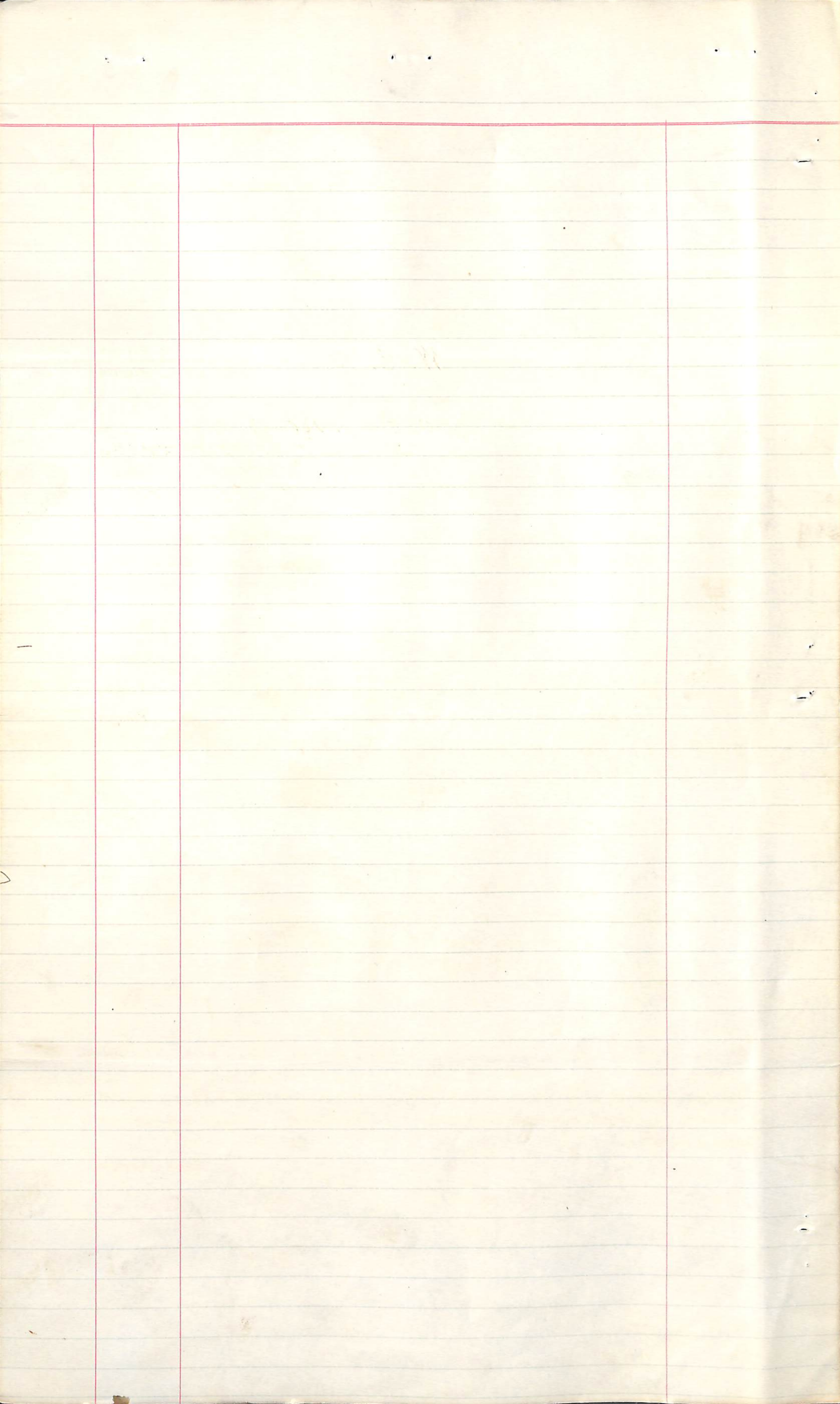

of the

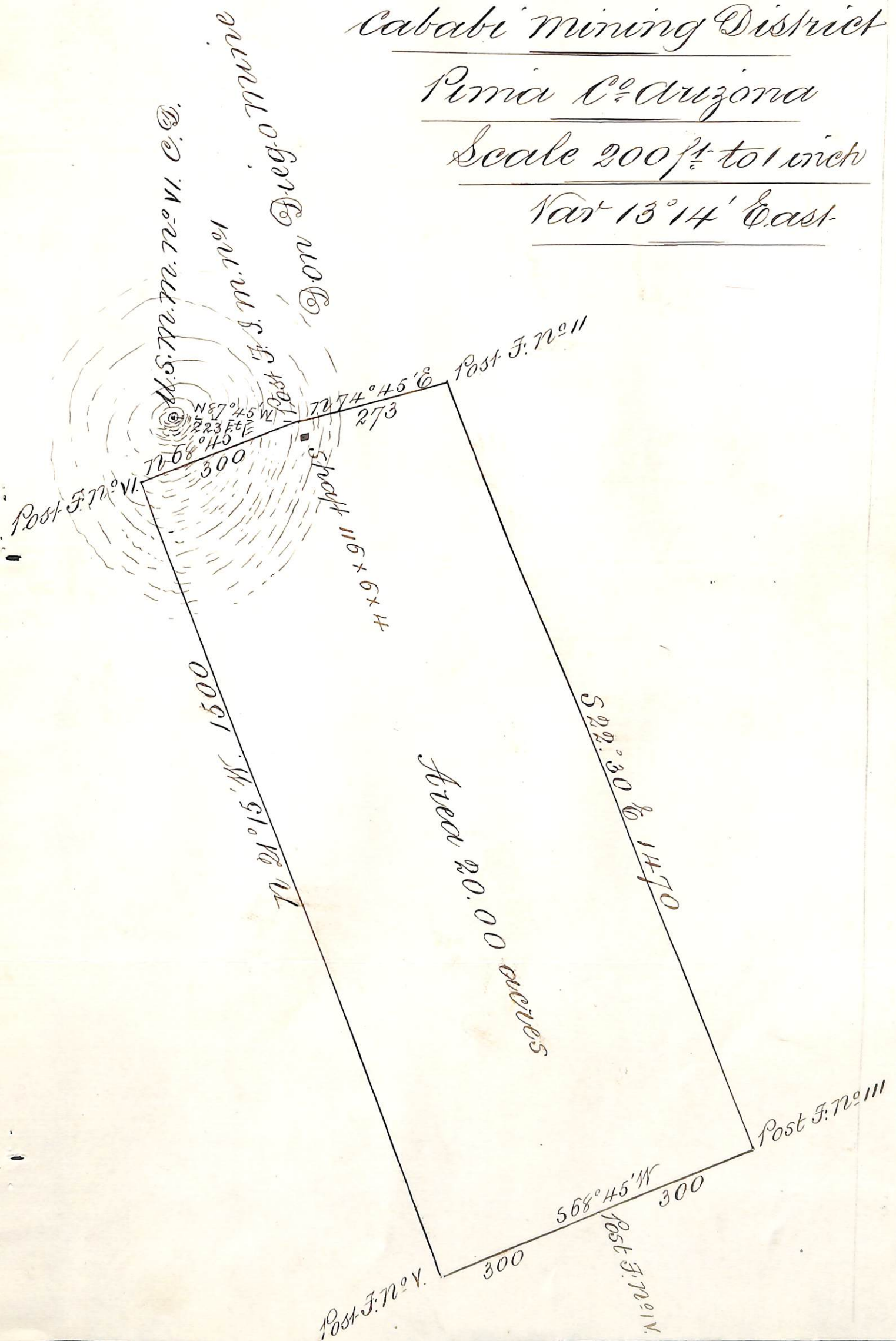
Florida Mining Claim
