I commence at Initial Point mentioned in notice of location, a monument of stones marking the S.W. corner of the Mark Twain Mining Claim and the N.E. end corner of the Buffalo Mining claim Lot No. 41, where I set a stone  $4 \times 8 \times 2$  x ins. marked "M. T.  
M. C. H. I. D. P." on surface of a rock marked +, and raised around it a monument of stones  $1\frac{1}{2}$  feet high.

Buffalo shaft is  $30^{\circ} E$   $8$  ft. distant.

Highest Point of Black Peak is  $7573^{\circ} E$   
South peak of Pinac is  $8.13^{\circ} W$ .

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925 The portion of this rock above ground is of such a nature that it is impractical to letter and number it.


