Description of Survey.

Beginning at the Initial Mon-
ument, mentioned in the loca-
tion notice and marking the
East-end center of Claim where
I drove an iron bolt - 18 inches
long, 1½ inches in dia, on the
dumps of the Discovery Shaft
on the vein, to mark the
initial point of survey which
was indicated by the crossings
at surface.


