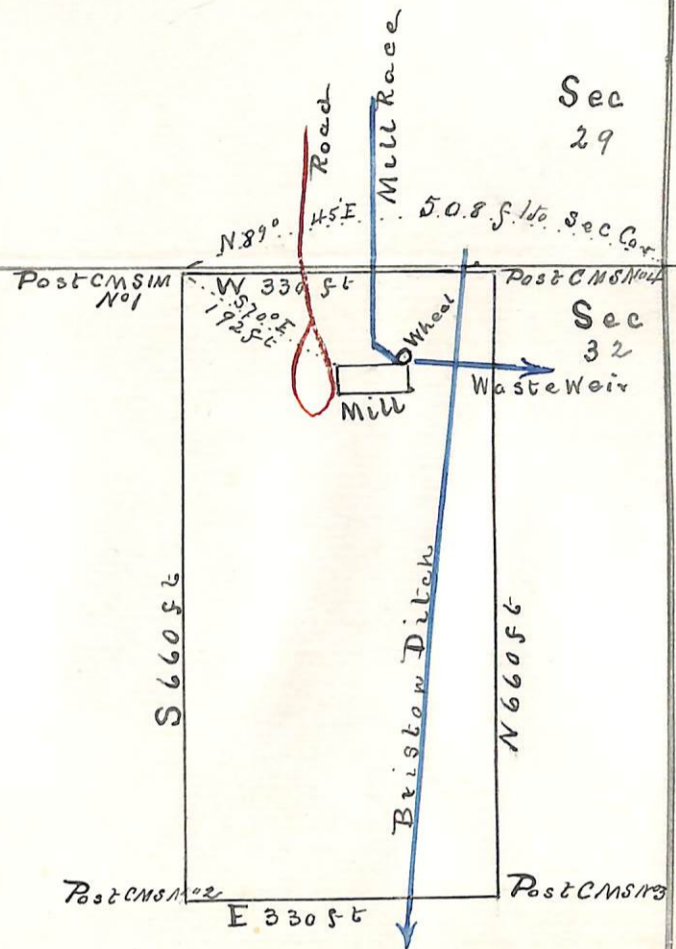




Geology of
