of the Survey of the

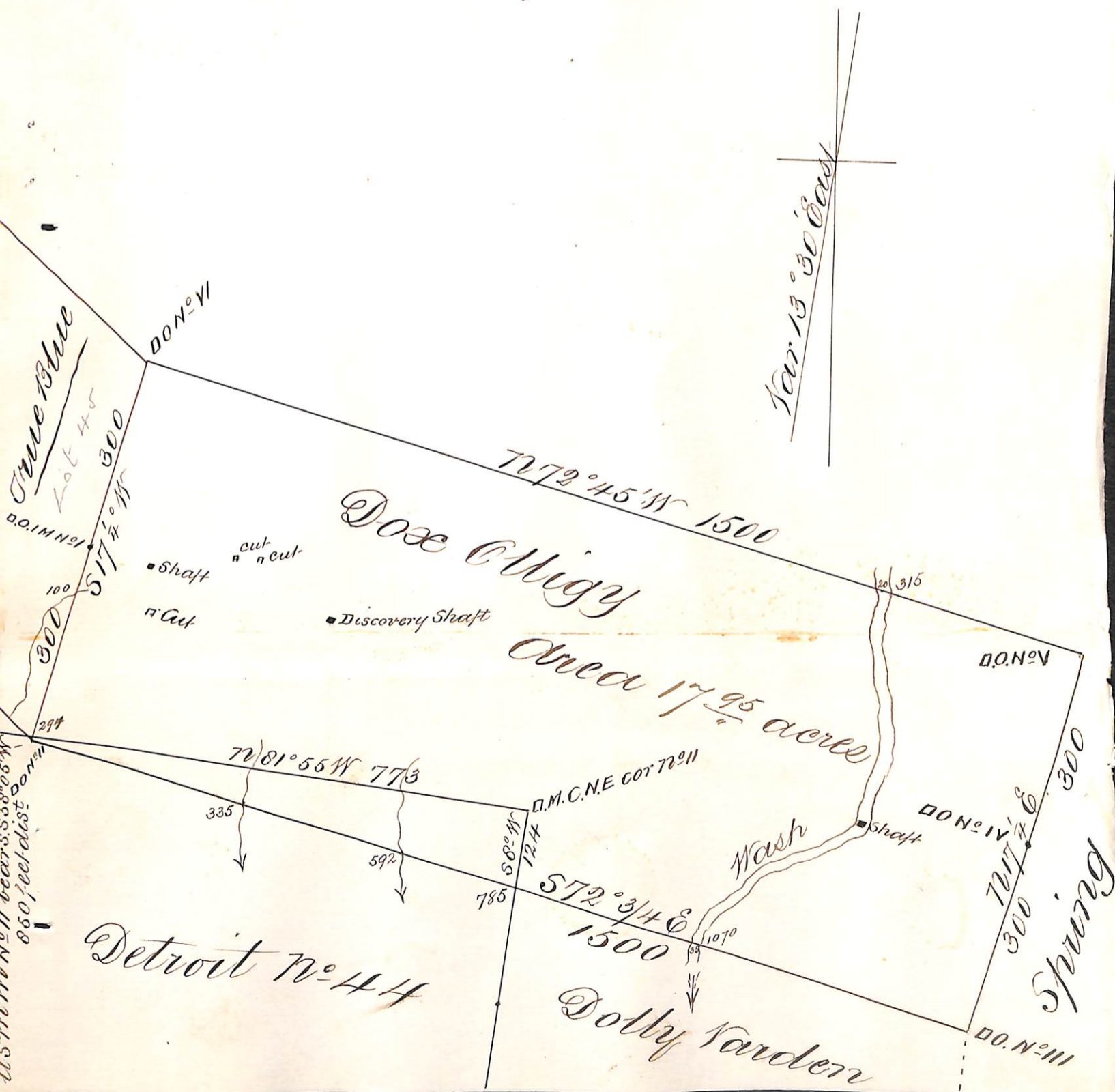
## Doe Elligz Mining Claim
