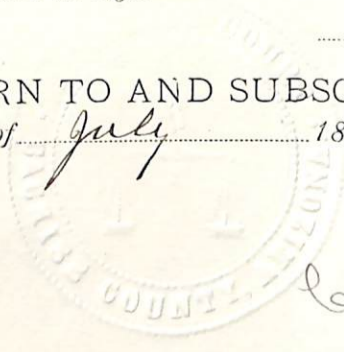

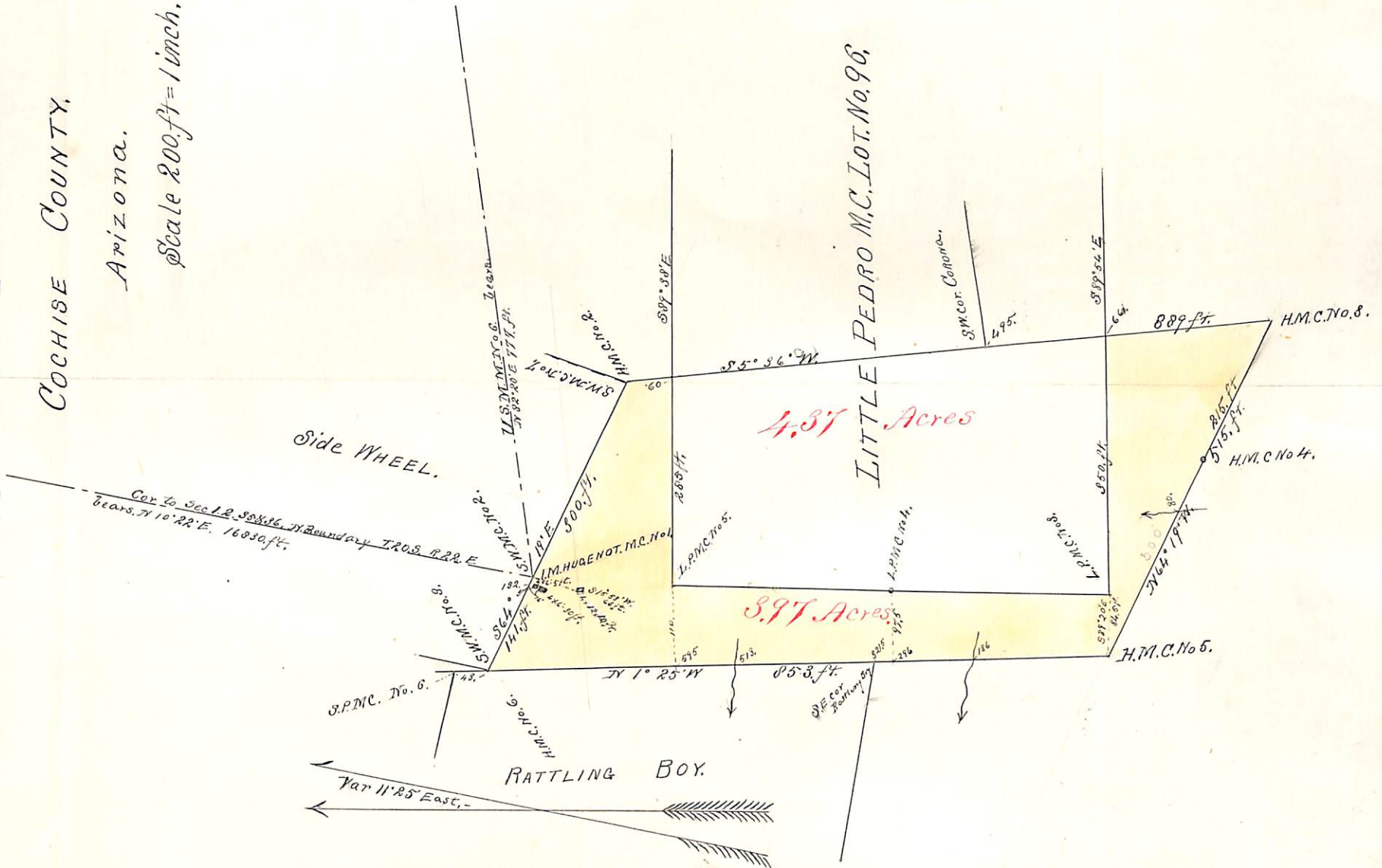
HUGENOT MINING CLAIM
