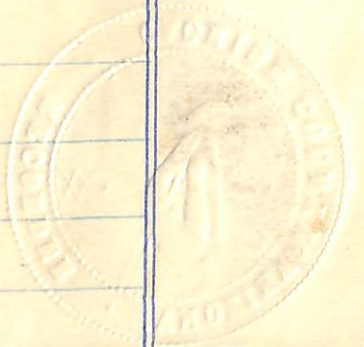

Know all men by these presents, that whereas, we, the undersigned, D.W. James and W.E. Dodge, Jr. have become the owners of the Belle Isle Mining Claim, in What is now known as the Warren Mining District, in Cochise County, Arizona Territory, and are desirous of obtaining a patent from the United States therefor; and Whereas there is some uncertainty in the recorded notices of location thereof, and we desire to correct the same, so as to fully comply with the mining laws of the United States, in respect to mining claims; Now therefore we, the said undersigned, do make and publish this amended notice of location thereof, and declare: That the said Belle Isle Mining Claim is the same claim heretofore, and on the 15th day of October, 1877, located by G.W. Atkins, on public mineral lands of the United States, in what he then called the Mule Pass Mining District, in what was then a part of the County of Pima, in said Territory, but which has, at nearly all times since been known and called the Warren Mining District since 1881 included in the said County of Cochise, the said location of said Atkins having been thereafter duly recorded in the office of the Recorder of said Pima County, on the 21st day of October, 1877, in Book 3 of Mining Claims, at page 391 of the transcribed Records of said County: That said ~~xxx~~ Belle Isle Claim is also the same claim thereafter sold and conveyed by said Atkins, to the extent of thirteen-sixteenths to R. E. Allen, S. W. Rea, D. R. Rea, James F. Duncan, and H. C. 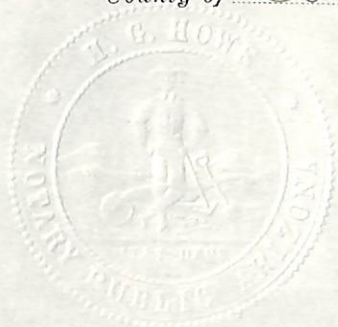

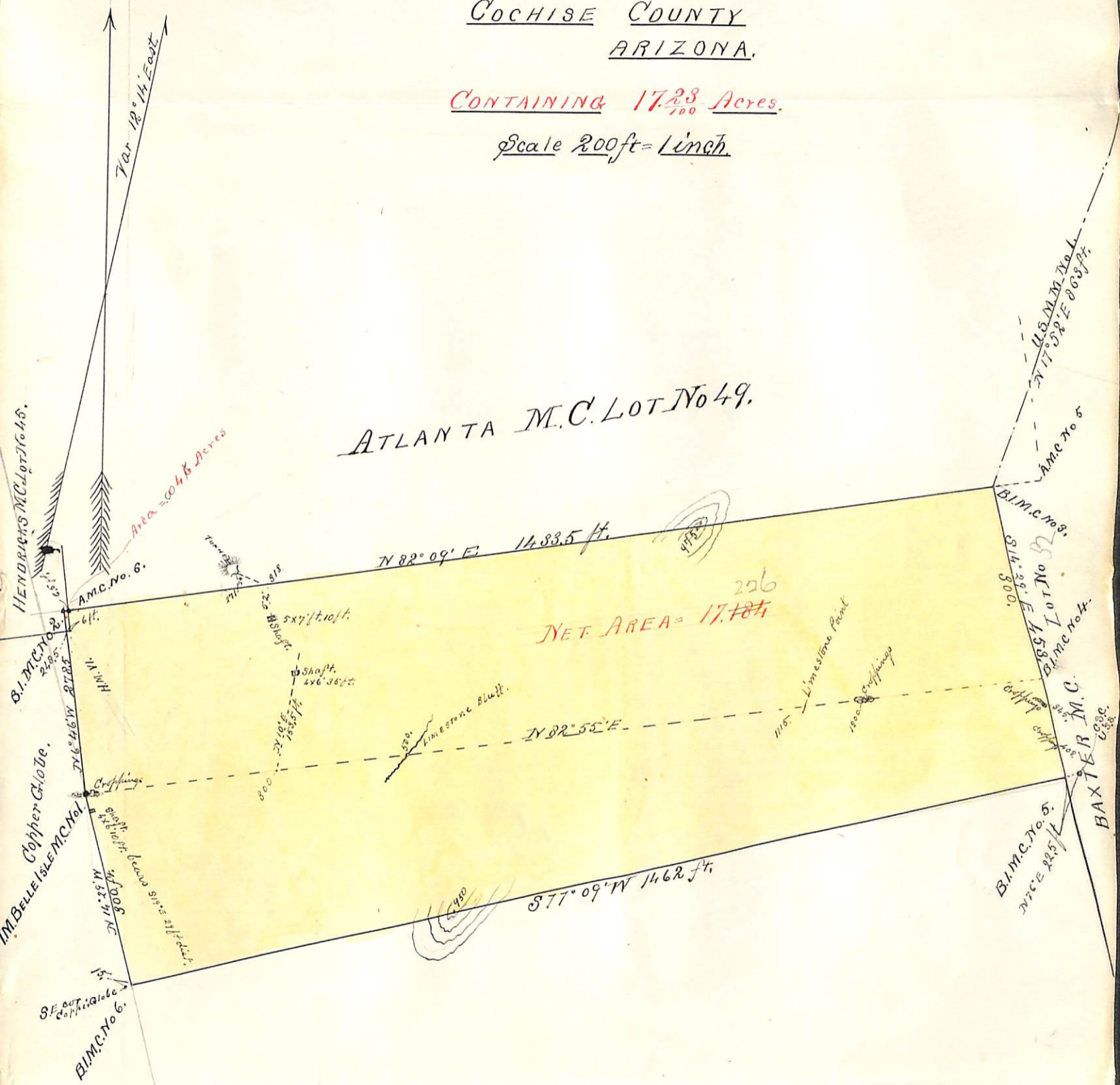
