Know all men by these presents, that I have this day located Fifteen Hundred (1500) Linear feet on this Lode, with all dip, spurs angles and variations with surface ground Six Hundred (600) feet in width, - commencing at a monument placed at a shaft on the lode at the extreme North-

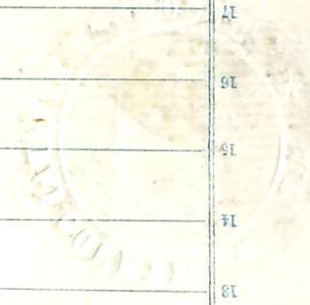
