the following Report: -

On the 16th 17th and 18th days of Nov. -
1885, I Made official Survey of the -
Red Cloud Mine and Mill-Site, for
J L Stiles Attorney for Claimants.
I found the Mine as Claimed in the
Notice of location, I had all the corners
identified by disinterested parties and
Made the Survey accordingly as per
Notes herewith, The work done on the
Mine has been done by the Claimants
and their Grantors, and consists of
Three Inclines and one Vertical Shaft.
and a large open cut, Costing evidently
Thousands of Dollars, and several
Thousand Tons of ore is piled up on
the dump. The surface of the claim
is rough but not much broken, the
Formation Granite, The Ledge well
defined, showing a width of about
Twenty feet of ore, I send you herewith
Specimens from the Mine. - -

After completing the Survey of the Mine
I measured, at considerable trouble
and expense, a true line from the
Initial Monument of the Mine to the
Initial point of the Mill Site, as the
Course is over some of the most rocky
points of Mountains in the Country, but
as my assistants were very careful -
Men. I was well satisfied with my work
and succeeded much better than I
expected. I found the Mill Site -

I could not find any corners of the Public Survey to connect my work with, although I expected to do so. and made diligent search for them, as I was informed, that some years ago, some sort of a Survey was made of the Township and Section lines along the River, but I found no trace of any, and Men who have lived there several years, say that no stakes or monuments were set by the party that claimed to have made the Survey, I have not been able to find any one who ever saw a U.S. Survey Stake above Castle Dome-Landing, I am therefore forced to believe that none were ever set. - and I had to leave my work in the best possible shape under the -

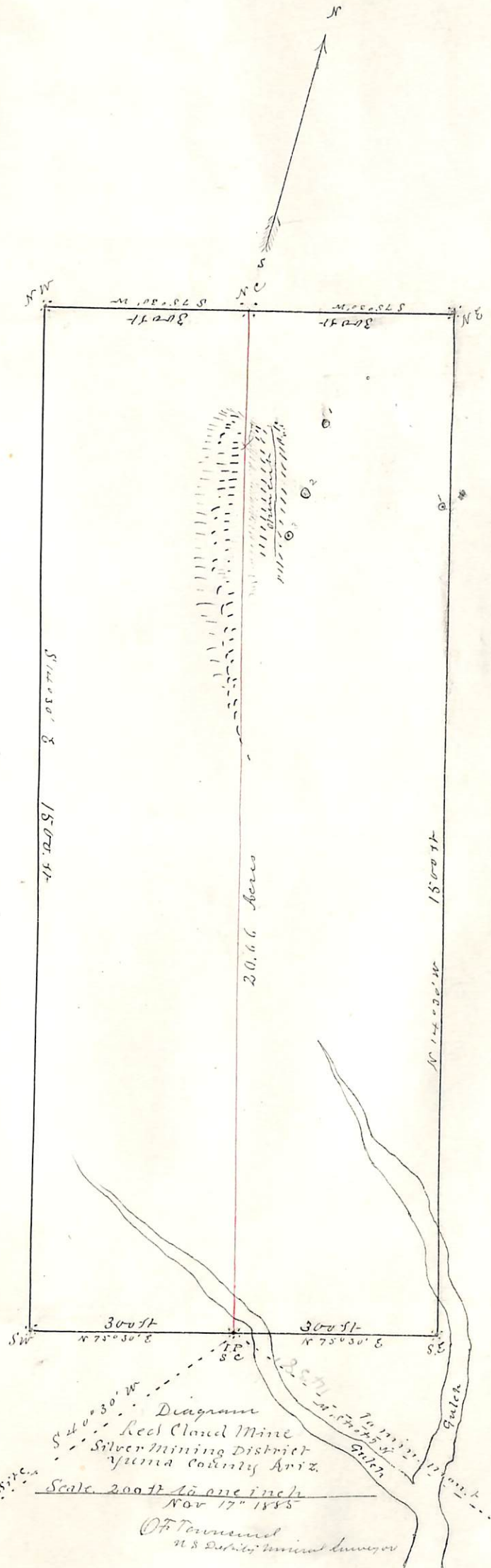


Diagram

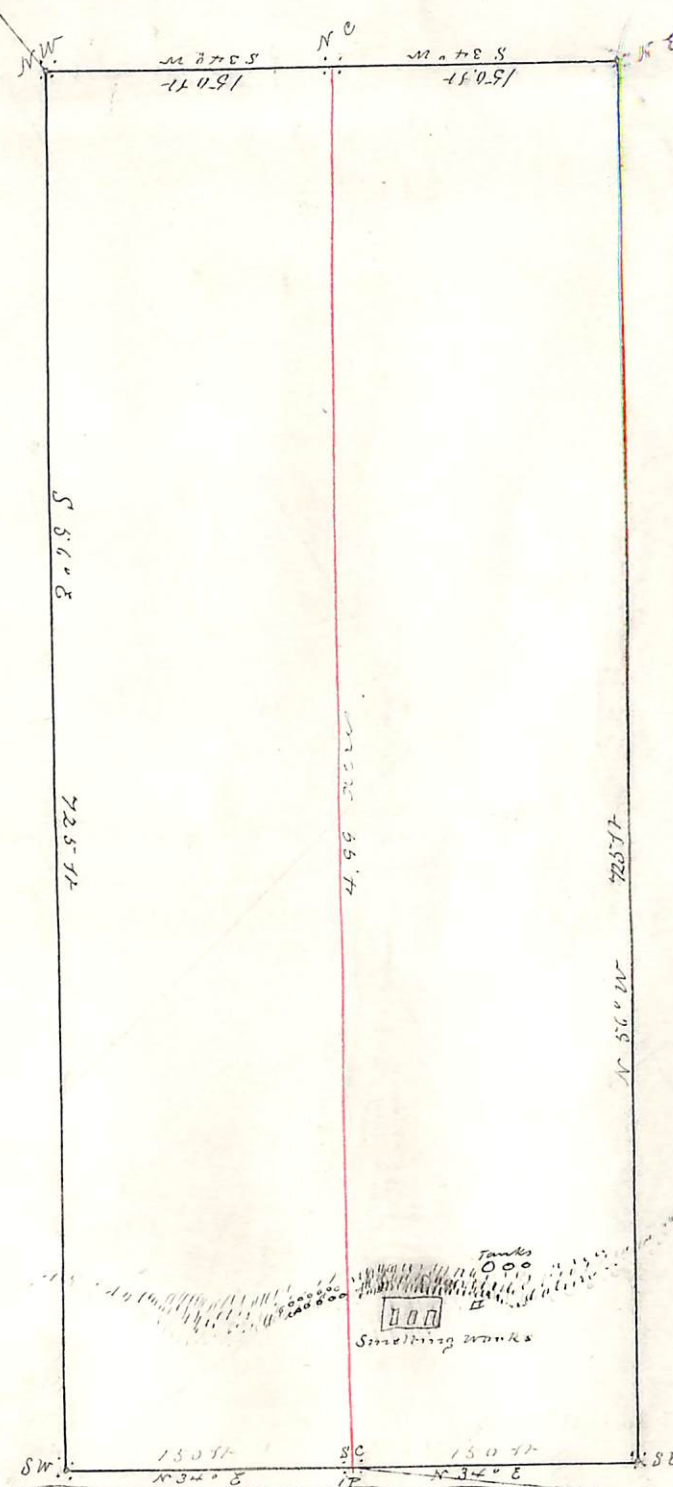
