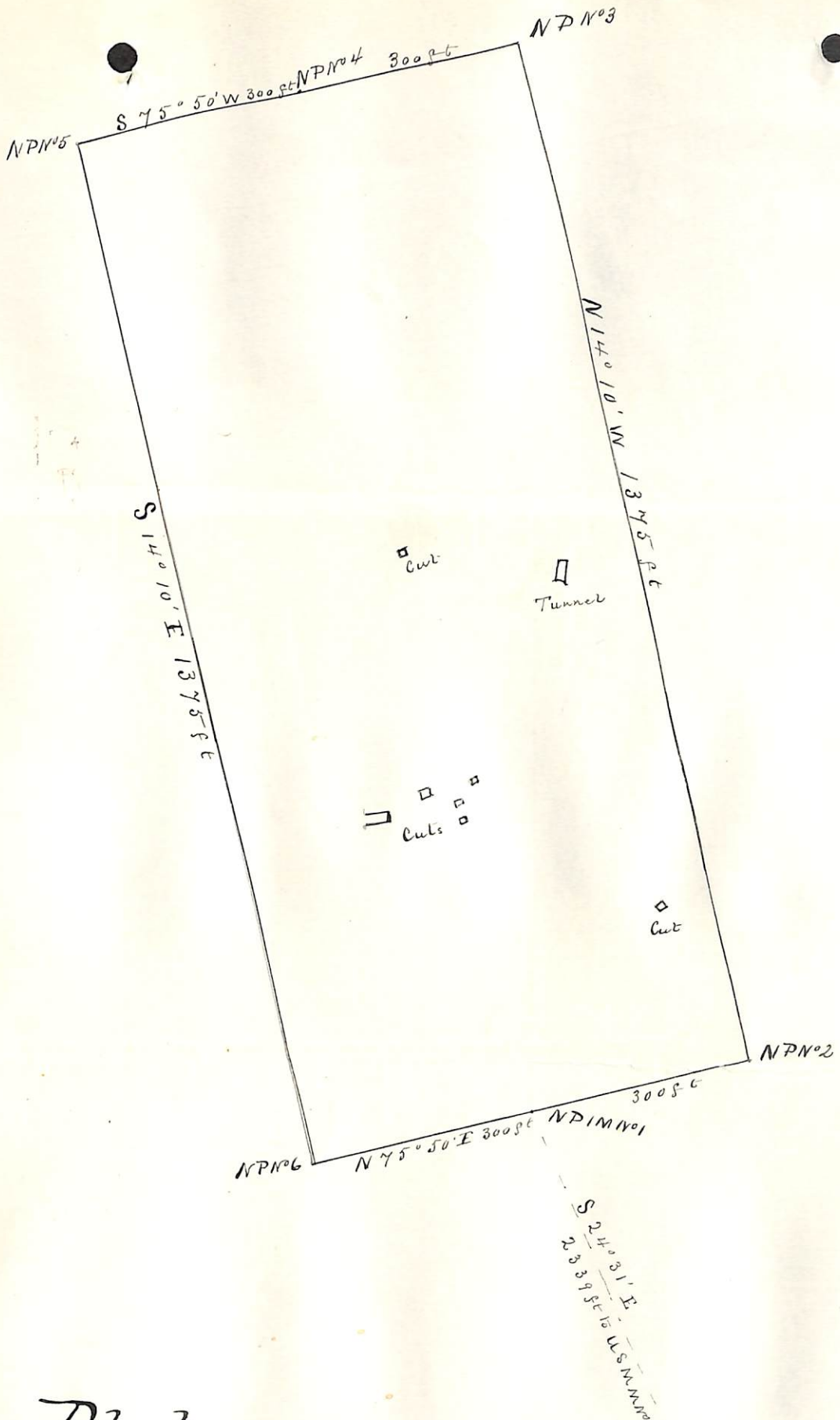

This amended survey was made with Berger & Sons Transit No. 5067 in good adjustment. Distances were measured with 500 ft. and 50 ft. steel tapes. All bearings were deflected from the true meridian as determined by observations on Polaris, checked by solar observations both direct and with Bergers patent solar adapter.

LOCATION.

This survey is located in Eureka Mining District, Yavapai County, Arizona, on unsurveyed ground, in about T. 14 N., R. 9 W., G. & S. R. B. & M., Latitude 34° 38' N.

ADJOINING CLAIMS.

Adjoining claims are Copper Slope, Copper Filling, and Trapezoid, all unsurveyed and all owned by claimant Company, which adjoin this survey on the west, northeast and southwest, respectively. Also the Black Mesa and the Mint lodes, Surs. Nos. 766 and 765 Am. on the northwest and southeast, respectively.

REPORT.

Recent and extensive developments show that the underlying ore body is of blanket formation, and that the lode line must therefore be imaginary, therefore, ^{missing} cor. Nos. 1 and 4, marking ends of same were not re-established.
