By virtue of the Mining act of May 10<sup>th</sup> 1872, & in conformity with mining Laws of the U.S. we the undersigned do this day locate & claim a mining claim of fifteen hundred feet in length along this Ledge or Lode of gold bearing rock, with three hundred feet on each side of the same as follows. 
