Report.

I find that the S.W. end line of the Empire mining Claim lot No 46, is common to one of the lines of the Township 1st S. Ext'n M.C. lot No 72. From the Official notes of lot No 72. (Surveyed by J. F. White) I take all the included angles and distances given by him, for the lines near the Empire line, and going upon the ground find the Posts as described in the Official Notes and as shown upon the map, being the distances and angles from Post T. N. 1st.

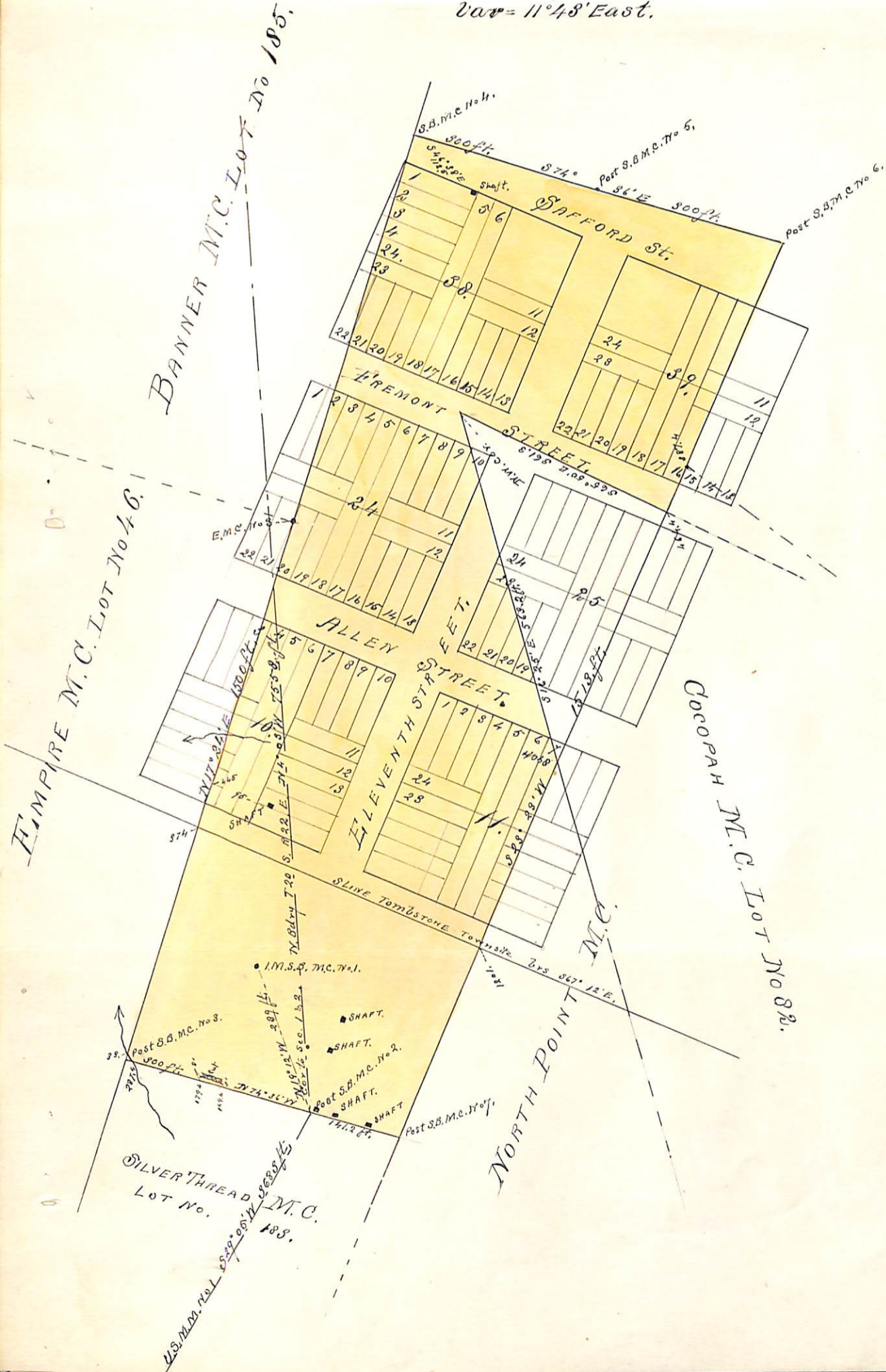
