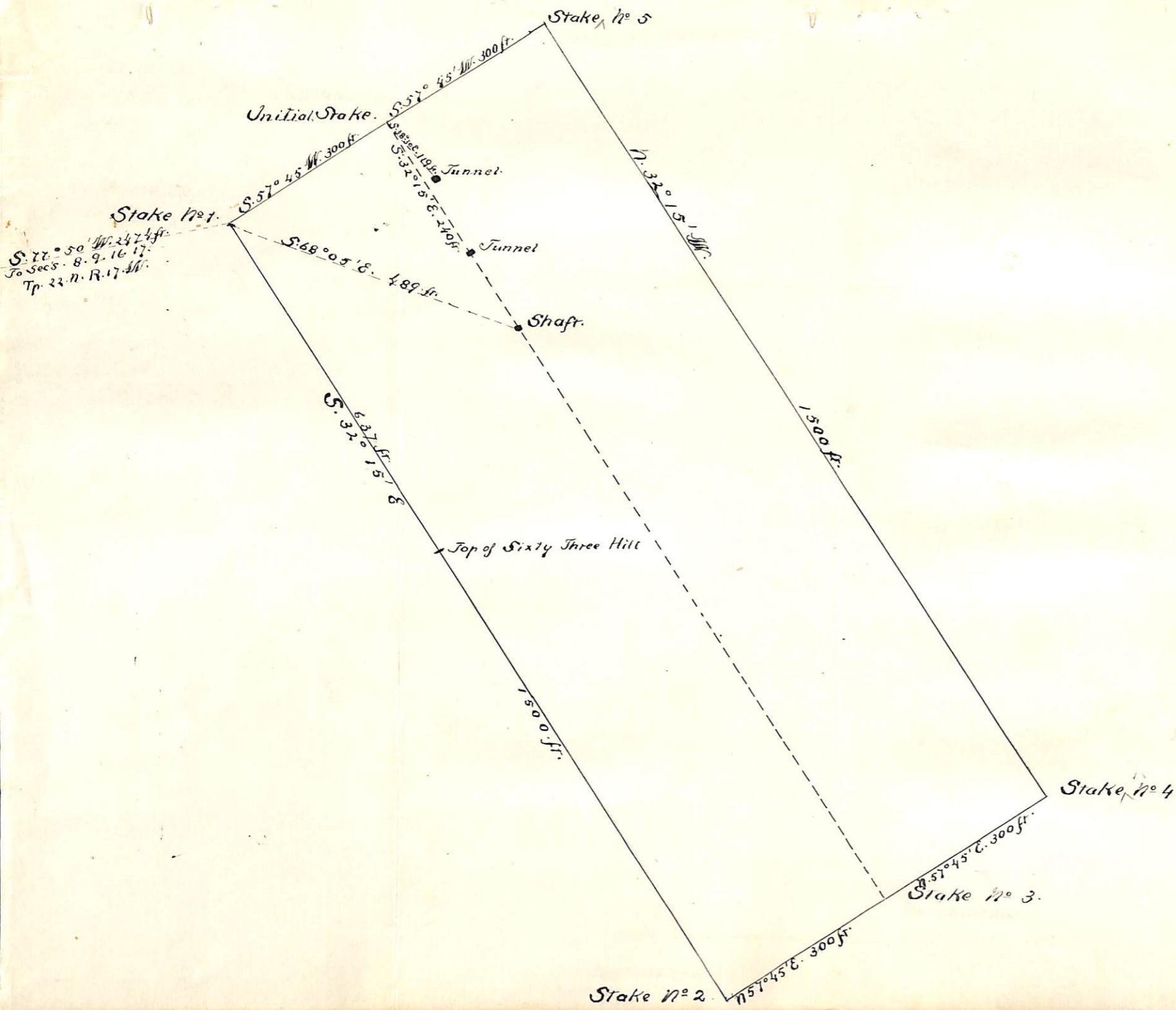

MINING CLAIM

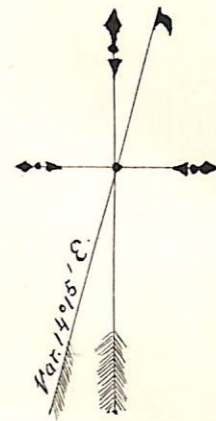
SITUATED IN


