NEW YORK MINING CLAIM

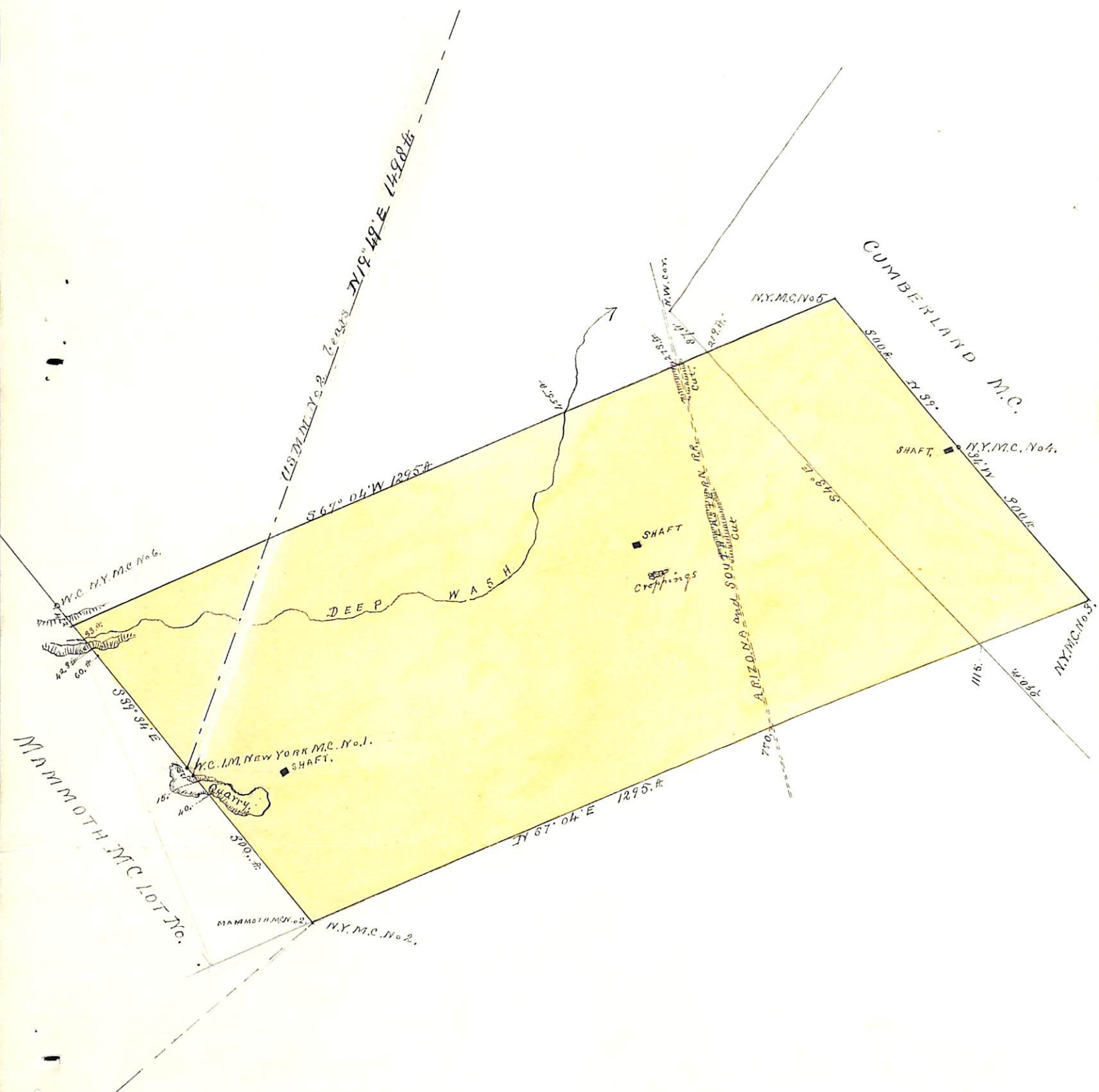
WARREN MINING DISTRICT
