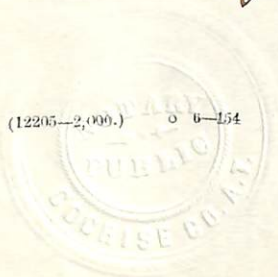

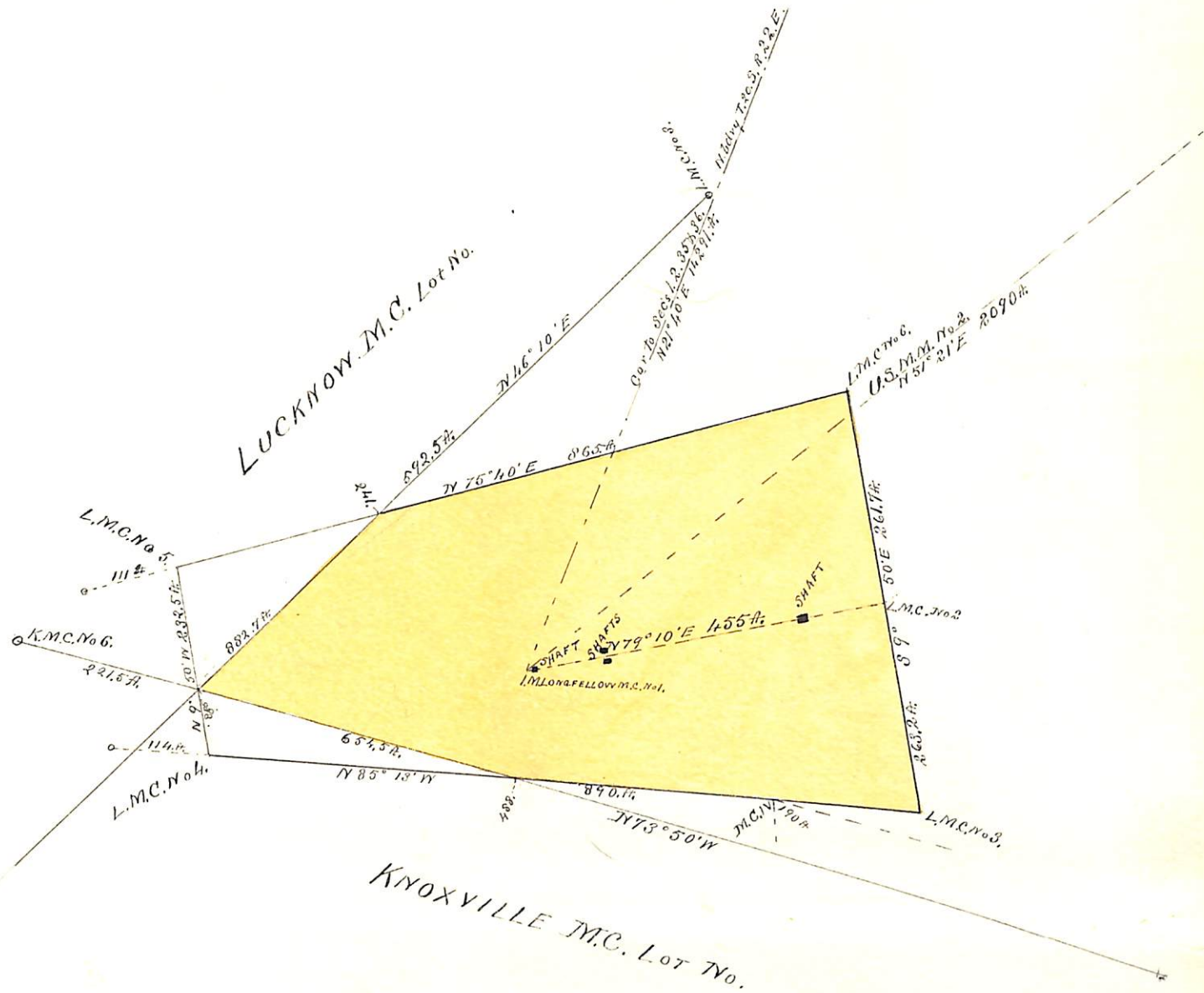


PLAT
