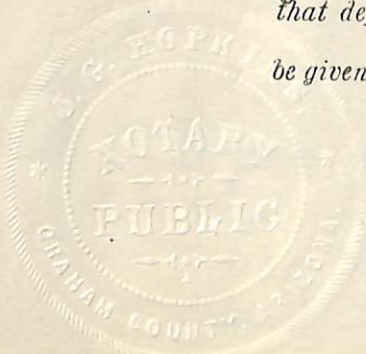

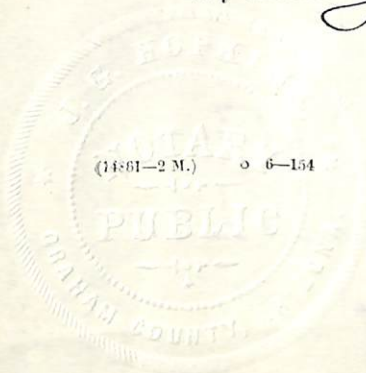

THE GOLD MOUNTAIN GOLD AND SILVER MINING AND REDUCTION COMPANY

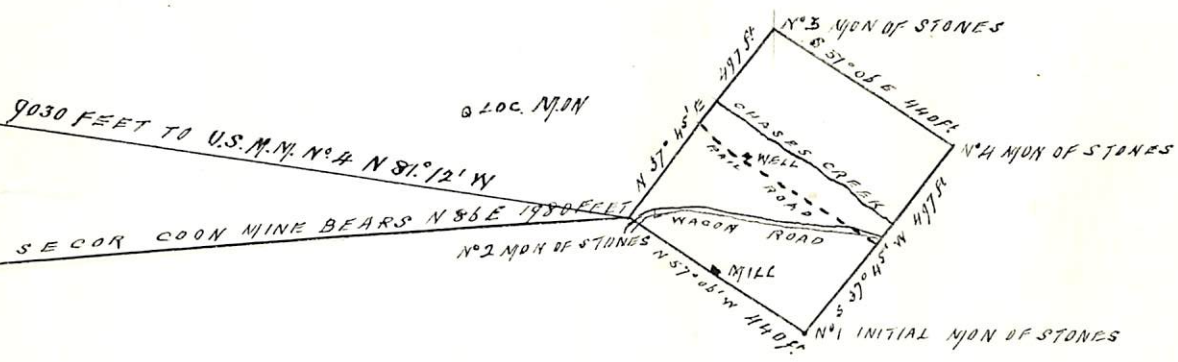
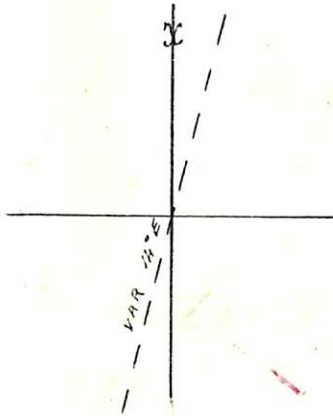
